SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 1705/76 new

Amends the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Administrative Act. Requires the Department of Human Services to create a program to select people listed on the Department's Prioritization of the Urgency of Need of Services (PUNS) database to receive housing and community-based support services. Provides that by June 30, 2022, no less than 50% of the persons selected from the PUNS database shall qualify for or receive community-based support services under the State's Home and Waiver Developmental Community-Based Services for Persons with Disabilities (State's Waiver Program); and no less than 50% of the persons selected from the PUNS database shall qualify for or receive both housing and community-based support services funded by the Department. Provides that by June 30, 2022, the Department shall fully eliminate the 8-person community-integrated living arrangements model as a housing option for persons eligible for services under the State's Waiver program and shall instead implement a flexible housing model, as defined by the Department by rule, that utilizes a needs-based sliding scale to determine a person's eligibility and placement for housing. Contains provisions concerning reporting requirements. Provides that implementation of the provisions shall be contingent on the receipt of all necessary federal approvals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 9 (a) The Department of Human Services shall create a program

- no less than 50% of the persons selected from the PUNS database

- 16 Persons with Developmental Disabilities. By June 30, 2022, no

- 20 (b) By June 30, 2022, the Department shall fully eliminate

- 2 flexible housing model, as defined by the Department by rule.
- 3 The flexible housing model shall utilize a needs-based sliding
- 4 scale to determine a person's eligibility and placement for
- 5 <u>housing.</u> The Department may adopt any rules necessary to
- 6 implement the provisions of this subsection.
- 7 (c) The Department of Human Services, in collaboration with
- 8 the Department of Healthcare and Family Services and any other
- 9 <u>interested State agencies</u>, shall submit a report to the General
- 10 Assembly on May 31, 2019, and each May 31 thereafter, that
- 11 <u>details the Department's progress in implementing the</u>
- 12 requirements under subsections (a) and (b).
- 13 (d) The Department, in collaboration with the Department of
- 14 Healthcare and Family Services, shall apply for any federal
- waivers or approvals necessary to implement the provisions of
- 16 this Section. Implementation of this Section shall be
- 17 contingent upon the receipt of all necessary federal approvals.
