#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

from Ch. 122, par. 14-6.02

105 ILCS 5/14-6.02 210 ILCS 125/32 215 ILCS 5/356z.29 new 510 ILCS 70/2.01c 625 ILCS 60/5 720 ILCS 5/48-8 730 ILCS 5/3-12-16

Amends the School Code, the Swimming Facility Act, the Humane Care for Animals Act, the Pedestrians with Disabilities Safety Act, the Criminal Code of 2012, and the Unified Code of Corrections. Defines "service animal" for the purposes of those Acts as an animal that has completed a formal training program for the purposes of assisting or accommodating a person's sensory, mental, physical, or psychiatric disability, including, but not limited to, a person with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or a traumatic brain injury, by performing tasks for the benefit of that person that are directly related to the person's disability. Amends the Insurance Code. Provides that an individual or group policy of accident and health insurance amended, delivered, issued, or renewed on or after the effective date of the amendatory Act shall provide coverage for the purchase of a service animal that has completed a formal training program for the purposes of assisting or accommodating a person's sensory, mental, physical, or psychiatric disability, including, but not limited to, a person with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or a traumatic brain injury, by performing tasks for the benefit of that person that are directly related to the person's disability, provided that the insured's health care provider certifies in writing that a service dog is medically necessary.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
14-6.02 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/14-6.02) (from Ch. 122, par. 14-6.02)

7 Sec. 14-6.02. Service animals. Service animals such as 8 quide dogs, signal dogs or any other animal individually 9 trained to perform tasks for the benefit of a student with a 10 disability shall be permitted to accompany that student at all school functions, whether in or outside the classroom. For the 11 purposes of this Section, "service animal" has the same meaning 12 as in Section 2.01c of the Humane Care for Animals Act 48 8 of 13 14 the Criminal Code of 2012.

Section 10. The Swimming Facility Act is amended by changing Section 32 as follows:

Sec. 32. Service animals. It is the duty of a licensee under this Act to allow the use of service animals as defined <u>in Section 2.01c of the Humane Care for Animals Act</u> and HB5790 - 2 - LRB100 17498 SLF 32667 b

prescribed in 28 C.F.R. 35.104, 28 C.F.R. 35.136, 28 C.F.R. 1 2 35.139, 28 C.F.R. 36.104, 28 C.F.R. 208, and 28 C.F.R. 302(c) if the service animal has been trained to perform a specific 3 task or work in the water and the use of such animal does not 4 5 pose a direct threat to the health and safety of the patrons of 6 the facility or the function or sanitary conditions of the 7 facility. Any use of a licensed swimming facility by an animal other than a service animal as authorized under this Section is 8 9 prohibited.

Section 15. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by adding Section 356z.29 as follows:

14 Sec. 356z.29. Coverage for service animal or service dog. 15 An individual or group policy of accident and health insurance amended, delivered, issued, or renewed on or after the 16 17 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly shall provide coverage for the purchase of a service 18 19 animal that has completed a formal training program for the 20 purposes of assisting or accommodating a person's sensory, 21 mental, physical, or psychiatric disability, including, but 22 not limited to, a person with post-traumatic stress disorder 23 (PTSD) or a traumatic brain injury, by performing tasks for the benefit of that person that are directly related to the 24

## person's disability, provided that the insured's health care provider certifies in writing that a service dog is medically necessary.

Section 20. The Humane Care for Animals Act is amended by
changing Section 2.01c as follows:

7 Sec. 2.01c. Service animal. "Service animal" means an 8 animal that has completed a formal training program for the 9 purposes of assisting or accommodating a person's sensory, 10 mental, physical, or psychiatric disability, including, but 11 not limited to, a person with post-traumatic stress disorder 12 (PTSD) or a traumatic brain injury, by performing tasks for the benefit of that person that are directly related to the 13 14 person's disability trained in obedience and task skills to 15 meet the needs of a person with a disability.

Section 25. The Pedestrians with Disabilities Safety Act isamended by changing Section 5 as follows:

Sec. 5. Definitions. For purposes of this Act: "Mobility device" means a support cane, walker, crutches, wheelchair, scooter, or other device, which may be necessary

1 for use by a pedestrian with a disability when traveling.

Pedestrian with a disability" means a person with a disability, as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act, who may require the use of a mobility device, service animal, or white cane to travel on the streets, sidewalks, highways, walkways, and walking, running, or bicycle paths of this State.

7 "Service animal" <u>has the same meaning ascribed to that term</u>
8 <u>in Section 2.01c of the Humane Care for Animals Act means a</u>
9 service animal as defined by the Code of Federal Regulations
10 (28 CFR 36.104).

11 "White cane" means a cane that is predominantly white or 12 metallic in color, with or without a red tip, that is held in 13 an extended or raised position.

Section 30. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by changing Section 48-8 as follows:

18 Sec. 48-8. Service animal access.

(a) When a person with a physical, mental, or intellectual disability requiring the use of a service animal is accompanied by a service animal or when a trainer of a service animal is accompanied by a service animal, neither the person nor the service animal shall be denied the right of entry and use of facilities of any public place of accommodation as defined in HB5790 - 5 - LRB100 17498 SLF 32667 b

1 Section 5-101 of the Illinois Human Rights Act.

2 For the purposes of this Section, "service animal" has the 3 same meaning ascribed to the term in Section 2.01c of the Humane Care for Animals Act means a dog or miniature horse 4 trained or being trained as a hearing animal, a guide animal, 5 an assistance animal, a seizure alert animal, a mobility 6 7 animal, a psychiatric service animal, an autism service animal, 8 or an animal trained for any other physical, mental, or intellectual disability. "Service animal" includes a miniature 9 10 horse that a public place of accommodation shall make 11 reasonable accommodation so long as the public place of 12 accommodation takes into consideration: (1) the type, size, and weight of the miniature horse and whether the facility 13 can accommodate its features; (2) whether the handler has 14 sufficient control of the miniature horse; (3) whether the 15 16 miniature horse is housebroken; and (4) whether the miniature 17 horse's presence in the facility compromises legitimate safety 18 requirements necessary for operation.

(b) A person who knowingly violates this Section commits aClass C misdemeanor.

2 Sec. 3-12-16. Helping Paws Service Dog Program.

3 (a) In this Section:

4 "Person with a disability" means a person who suffers from
5 a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one
6 or more major life activities.

7 "Program" means the Helping Paws Service Dog Program8 created by this Section.

9 "Service dog" <u>has the same meaning ascribed to the term</u> 10 <u>"service animal" in Section 2.01c of the Humane Care for</u> 11 <u>Animals Act, except the animal is a dog means a dog trained in</u> 12 <del>obedience and task skills to meet the needs of a person with a</del> 13 <del>disability</del>.

14 "Animal care professional" means a person certified to work 15 in animal care related services, such as grooming, kenneling, 16 and any other related fields.

17 "Service dog professional" means a person certified to 18 train service dogs by an agency, organization, or school 19 approved by the Department.

20 "Veteran" means an Illinois resident who is a veteran as 21 defined in subsection (h) of Section 1491 of Title 10 of the 22 United States Code.

(b) The Department may establish the Helping Paws Service Dog Program to train committed persons to be service dog trainers and animal care professionals. The Department shall select committed persons in various correctional institutions - 7 - LRB100 17498 SLF 32667 b

1 and facilities to participate in the Program.

2 (c) Priority for participation in the Program must be given
3 to committed persons who either have a high school diploma or
4 have passed high school equivalency testing.

5 (d) The Department may contract with service doq 6 professionals to train committed persons to be certified service dog trainers. Service dog professionals shall train 7 committed persons in dog obedience training, service dog 8 9 training, and animal health care. Upon successful completion of 10 the training, a committed person shall receive certification by 11 an agency, organization, or school approved by the Department.

12 (e) The Department may designate a non-profit organization 13 to select animals from humane societies and shelters for the 14 purpose of being trained as service dogs and for participation 15 in any program designed to train animal care professionals.

16 (f) After a dog is trained by the committed person as a 17 service dog, a review committee consisting of an equal number 18 of persons from the Department and the non-profit organization 19 shall select a person with a disability or a veteran with 20 post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or depression to receive 21 the service dog free of charge.

(g) Employees of the Department shall periodically visit persons with disabilities who have received service dogs from the Department under this Section to determine whether the needs of the persons with disabilities or veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or depression have been

1 met by the service dogs trained by committed persons.

2 (h) Employees of the Department shall periodically visit 3 committed persons who have been certified as service dog 4 trainers or animal care professionals and who have been paroled 5 or placed on mandatory supervised release to determine whether 6 the committed persons are using their skills as certified 7 service dog trainers or animal care professionals.
