1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 25

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_. Amend House Joint Resolution 25 by

3 deleting everything and replacing it with the following:

"WHEREAS, The development of distributed databases and ledgers protected against revision by publicly-verifiable open source cryptographic algorithms, and protected from data loss by distributed records sharing, colloquially called "blockchain", has reached a point where the opportunities for efficiency, cost savings, and cybersecurity deserve

10 legislative study; and

WHEREAS, Blockchain technology is a promising way to facilitate a transition to more efficient government service delivery models and economies of scale, including facilitating safe, paperless transactions, and permanent recordkeeping immune to cyber-attacks, and data destruction; and

WHEREAS, Blockchain technology can reduce the prevalence of government's disparate, computer systems, databases, and custom-built software interfaces, reducing costs associated with maintenance and implementation and allowing more regions of the state to participate in electronic government services; and

WHEREAS, Nations and municipalities across the world are studying and implementing government reforms that bolster trust and reduce bureaucracy through verifiable open source blockchain technology in a variety of use cases from medical records, land records, banking, and property auctions; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois, through the recently created Illinois Blockchain Initiative, has promoted a collaborative regulatory exchange with technology firms, software developers, and service providers, so that if regulation is needed, it will be the product of a collaborative and proactive approach, with the goal of encouraging economic development through innovation; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that there is created the Illinois Legislative Blockchain and Distributed Ledger Task Force to study how and if State, county, and municipal governments can benefit from a transition to a

- 3 RESOLVED, That the Task Force will consist of the following 4 members:
- (1) two members appointed by the Speaker of the House 5 of Representatives, one who shall be designated as 6 7 Co-Chairperson;
- (2) two members appointed by the House Minority Leader; 8
- 9 (3) two members appointed by the President of the Senate, one who shall be designated as Co-Chairperson; 10
- 11 (4) two members appointed by the Senate Minority 12 Leader;
- 13 (5) one member appointed by the Cook County Recorder of 14 Deeds;
- (6) one member appointed by the Cook County Clerk; 15
- 16 (7) one member appointed by the state Division of 17 Banking;

1	(8) one member appointed by the Secretary of State;
2	(9) one member appointed by the Illinois Department of
3	Commerce and Economic Opportunity;
4	(10) two members appointed by the Illinois Department
5	of Innovation and Technology;

10	RESOLVED, That all appointments shall be confirmed by both
11	Co-Chairpersons; and be it further
12	RESOLVED, That all appointments to the Task Force shall be
13	made within 60 days after the adoption of this resolution;
14	vacancies in the Task Force shall be filled by their respective
15	appointing authorities within 30 days after the vacancy occurs;
16	and be it further
17	RESOLVED, That the Task Force members shall serve without

compensation; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Task Force may employ skilled experts with the approval of the Co-Chairpersons, and shall receive the 2 3 cooperation of any State agencies it deems appropriate to 4 assist the Task Force in carrying out its duties; and be it

- RESOLVED, That the members of the Task Force shall be 6 7 considered members with voting rights; a quorum of the Task 8 Force shall consist of a majority of the members; and be it 9 further
- RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall meet initially at the 10 11 call of the Co-Chairpersons, no later than 90 days after the 12 adoption of this resolution, and shall thereafter meet at the 13 call of the Co-Chairpersons; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Innovation and 15 Technology shall provide administrative and other support to the Task Force; and be it further 16
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall research, analyze, and consider: 18
