1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The tragedy that occurred on October 1, 2017 in 3 Las Vegas, Nevada, where 58 people were killed and more than 4 500 were injured by a lone gunman who had equipped his firearms 5 with bump stocks, brought the use of bump stocks into the 6 national spotlight; and

- WHEREAS, In 2010, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives determined that a bump stock is not regulated as a firearm under Federal law, namely the Gun Control Act or the National Firearms Act; and
- 11 WHEREAS, A bump stock is designed to allow a semi-automatic 12 rifle to function like a fully-automatic rifle; therefore, be 13 it
- RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
 HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we
 believe devices designed to allow semi-automatic rifles to
 function like fully-automatic rifles should be regulated,
 consistent with fully-automatic rifles under the National
 Firearms Act; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That we urge the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, 21 Firearms and Explosives to regulate devices designed to allow

- 1 semi-automatic rifles to function like fully-automatic rifles;
- 2 and be it further;
- 3 RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be
- 4 presented to each member of the Illinois Congressional
- 5 delegation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and
- 6 Explosives.
