1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 309

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 309 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The University of Illinois Hospital Act is
5 amended by adding Section 8b as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 330/8b new)

7 Sec. 8b. Captioning required. A television in a waiting
8 room provided for use by the general public at the University
9 of Illinois Hospital, in a patient room provided for use by
10 patients being treated by the University of Illinois Hospital,
11 or in a patient room provided for use by individuals using or
12 requesting services at the University of Illinois Hospital must
13 have a closed captioning feature activated at all times if the
14 television includes a captioning feature.

15 The University of Illinois Hospital must make reasonable
16 efforts to prevent members of the general public and

1 individuals using or requesting services from independently
2 deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a violation of
3 this Section if the captioning feature is deactivated by a
4 member of the general public or an individual using or
5 requesting services at the University of Illinois Hospital, so
6 long as the captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable
7 by a member of the University of Illinois Hospital's staff upon
8 knowledge that the deactivation has occurred.

9 If the University of Illinois Hospital does not have a
10 television that includes a captioning feature, then the
11 University of Illinois Hospital must obtain a sufficient number
12 of televisions that include a captioning feature as soon as is
13 practicable. This Section does not affect any other provision
14 of law relating to disability discrimination or providing
15 reasonable accommodations or diminish the rights of a person
16 with a disability under any other law.

17 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" or
18 "captioning" means a text display of spoken words presented on
19 a television or movie screen that allows a deaf or hard of
20 hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the action of a
21 program simultaneously.

22 Section 10. The Alternative Health Care Delivery Act is
23 amended by adding Section 35.5 as follows:

24 (210 ILCS 3/35.5 new)

1 Sec. 35.5. Captioning required. A television in a waiting
2 room provided for use by the general public at an alternative
3 health care model licensed under this Act, in a patient room
4 provided for use by patients being treated by an alternative
5 health care model licensed under this Act, or in a patient room
6 provided for use by individuals using or requesting services at
7 an alternative health care model licensed under this Act must
8 have a closed captioning feature activated at all times if the
9 television includes a captioning feature.

10 An alternative health care model licensed under this Act
11 must make reasonable efforts to prevent members of the general
12 public and individuals using or requesting services from
13 independently deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a
14 violation of this Section if the captioning feature is
15 deactivated by a member of the general public or an individual
16 using or requesting services at an alternative health care
17 model licensed under this Act, so long as the captioning is
18 reactivated as soon as is practicable by a member of the
19 alternative health care model's staff upon knowledge that the
20 deactivation has occurred.

21 If an alternative health care model licensed under this Act
22 does not have a television that includes a captioning feature,
23 then the alternative health care model must obtain a sufficient
24 number of televisions that include a captioning feature as soon
25 as is practicable. This Section does not affect any other
26 provision of law relating to disability discrimination or

1 providing reasonable accommodations or diminish the rights of a
2 person with a disability under any other law.

3 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" or
4 "captioning" means a text display of spoken words presented on
5 a television or movie screen that allows a deaf or hard of
6 hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the action of a
7 program simultaneously.

8 Section 15. The Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act is
9 amended by adding Section 7c as follows:

10 (210 ILCS 5/7c new)

11 Sec. 7c. Captioning required. A television in a waiting
12 room provided for use by the general public at an ambulatory
13 surgical treatment center licensed under this Act, in a patient
14 room provided for use by patients being treated by an
15 ambulatory surgical treatment center licensed under this Act,
16 or in a patient room provided for use by individuals using or
17 requesting services at an ambulatory surgical treatment center
18 licensed under this Act must have a closed captioning feature
19 activated at all times if the television includes a captioning
20 feature.

21 An ambulatory surgical treatment center licensed under
22 this Act must make reasonable efforts to prevent members of the
23 general public and individuals using or requesting services
24 from independently deactivating a captioning feature. It is not

1 a violation of this Section if the captioning feature is
2 deactivated by a member of the general public or an individual
3 using or requesting services at an ambulatory surgical
4 treatment center licensed under this Act, so long as the
5 captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable by a member
6 of the ambulatory surgical treatment center's staff upon
7 knowledge that the deactivation has occurred.

8 If an ambulatory surgical treatment center licensed under
9 this Act does not have a television that includes a captioning
10 feature, then the ambulatory surgical treatment center must
11 obtain a sufficient number of televisions that include a
12 captioning feature as soon as is practicable. This Section does
13 not affect any other provision of law relating to disability
14 discrimination or providing reasonable accommodations or
15 diminish the rights of a person with a disability under any
16 other law.

17 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" or
18 "captioning" means a text display of spoken words presented on
19 a television or movie screen that allows a deaf or hard of
20 hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the action of a
21 program simultaneously.

22 Section 20. The Community Living Facilities Licensing Act
23 is amended by adding Section 5.5 as follows:

24 (210 ILCS 35/5.5 new)

1 Sec. 5.5. Captioning required. A television in a waiting
2 room provided for use by the general public at a Community
3 Living Facility licensed under this Act, in a resident room
4 provided for use by residents being treated by a Community
5 Living Facility licensed under this Act, or in a resident room
6 provided for use by individuals using or requesting services at
7 a Community Living Facility licensed under this Act must have a
8 closed captioning feature activated at all times if the
9 television includes a captioning feature.

10 A Community Living Facility licensed under this Act must
11 make reasonable efforts to prevent members of the general
12 public and individuals using or requesting services from
13 independently deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a
14 violation of this Section if the captioning feature is
15 deactivated by a member of the general public or an individual
16 using or requesting services at a Community Living Facility
17 licensed under this Act, so long as the captioning is
18 reactivated as soon as is practicable by a member of the
19 Community Living Facility's staff upon knowledge that the
20 deactivation has occurred.

21 If a Community Living Facility licensed under this Act does
22 not have a television that includes a captioning feature, then
23 the Community Living Facility must obtain a sufficient number
24 of televisions that include a captioning feature as soon as is
25 practicable. This Section does not affect any other provision
26 of law relating to disability discrimination or providing

1 reasonable accommodations or diminish the rights of a person
2 with a disability under any other law.

3 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" or
4 "captioning" means a text display of spoken words presented on
5 a television or movie screen that allows a deaf or hard of
6 hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the action of a
7 program simultaneously.

8 Section 25. The Nursing Home Care Act is amended by adding
9 Section 3-801.2 as follows:

10 (210 ILCS 45/3-801.2 new)

11 Sec. 3-801.2. Captioning required. A television in a
12 waiting room provided for use by the general public at a
13 facility licensed under this Act, a resident room provided for
14 use by residents being treated by a facility licensed under
15 this Act, or in a resident room provided for use by individuals
16 using or requesting services at a facility licensed under this
17 Act must have a closed captioning feature activated at all
18 times if the television includes a captioning feature.

19 A facility licensed under this Act must make reasonable
20 efforts to prevent members of the general public and
21 individuals using or requesting services from independently
22 deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a violation of
23 this Section if the captioning feature is deactivated by a
24 member of the general public or an individual using or

1 requesting services at a facility licensed under this Act, so
2 long as the captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable
3 by a member of the facility's staff upon knowledge that the

24 use by residents being treated by a facility licensed under

1 this Act, or in a resident room provided for use by individuals
2 using or requesting services at a facility licensed under this
3 Act must have a closed captioning feature activated at all
4 times if the television includes a captioning feature.

5 A facility licensed under this Act must make reasonable
6 efforts to prevent members of the general public and
7 individuals using or requesting services from independently
8 deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a violation of
9 this Section if the captioning feature is deactivated by a
10 member of the general public or an individual using or
11 requesting services at a facility licensed under this Act, so
12 long as the captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable

8 for use by residents being treated by a facility licensed under
9 this Act, or in a resident room provided for use by individuals
10 using or requesting services at a facility licensed under this
11 Act must have a closed captioning feature activated at all
12 times if the television includes a captioning feature.

13 A facility licensed under this Act must make reasonable
14 efforts to prevent members of the general public and
15 individuals using or requesting services from independently
16 deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a violation of
17 this Section if the captioning feature is deactivated by a
18 member of the general public or an individual using or
19 requesting services at a facility licensed under this Act, so
20 long as the captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable

16 waiting room provided for use by the general public at a
17 facility licensed under this Act, in a consumer room provided
18 for use by consumers being treated by a facility licensed under
19 this Act, or in a consumer room provided for use by individuals
20 using or requesting services at a facility licensed under this
21 Act must have a closed captioning feature activated at all
22 times if the television includes a captioning feature.

23 A facility licensed under this Act must make reasonable
24 efforts to prevent members of the general public and

1 individuals using or requesting services from independently
2 deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a violation of
3 this Section if the captioning feature is deactivated by a
4 member of the general public or an individual using or
5 requesting services at a facility licensed under this Act, so
6 long as the captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable
7 by a member of the facility's staff upon knowledge that the
8 deactivation has occurred.

9 If a facility licensed under this Act does not have a

3 licensed under this Act, in a patient room provided for use by
4 patients being treated by a hospital licensed under this Act,
5 or in a patient room provided for use by individuals using or
6 requesting services at a hospital licensed under this Act must
7 have a closed captioning feature activated at all times if the
8 television includes a captioning feature.

9 A hospital licensed under this Act must make reasonable
10 efforts to prevent members of the general public and
11 individuals using or requesting services from independently
12 deactivating a captioning feature. It is not a violation of
13 this Section if the captioning feature is deactivated by a
14 member of the general public or an individual using or
15 requesting services at a hospital licensed under this Act, so
16 long as the captioning is reactivated as soon as is practicable
17 by a member of the hospital's staff upon knowledge that the
18 deactivation has occurred.

19 If a hospital licensed under this Act does not have a
20 television that includes a captioning feature, then the
21 hospital must obtain a sufficient number of televisions that
22 include a captioning feature as soon as is practicable. This
23 Section does not affect any other provision of law relating to
24 disability discrimination or providing reasonable
25 accommodations or diminish the rights of a person with a
26 disability under any other law.

1 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" or
2 "captioning" means a text display of spoken words presented on
3 a television or movie screen that allows a deaf or hard of
4 hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the action of a
5 program simultaneously.

6 Section 50. The Community-Integrated Living Arrangements
7 Licensure and Certification Act is amended by adding Section
8 10.5 as follows:

9 (210 ILCS 135/10.5 new)

10 Sec. 10.5. Captioning required. A television in a waiting
11 room provided for use by the general public at a
12 community-integrated living arrangement certified under this
13 Act, in a resident room provided for use by residents being
14 treated by a community-integrated living arrangement certified
15 under this Act, or in a resident room provided for use by
16 individuals using or requesting services at a
17 community-integrated living arrangement certified under this
18 Act must have a closed captioning feature activated at all
19 times if the television includes a captioning feature.

20 A community-integrated living arrangement certified under
21 this Act must make reasonable efforts to prevent members of the
22 general public and individuals using or requesting services
23 from independently deactivating a captioning feature. It is not
24 a violation of this Section if the captioning feature is

1 deactivated by a member of the general public or an individual
2 using or requesting services at a community-integrated living
3 arrangement certified under this Act, so long as the captioning
4 is reactivated as soon as is practicable by a member of the
5 community-integrated living arrangement's staff upon knowledge
6 that the deactivation has occurred.

7 If a community-integrated living arrangement certified
8 under this Act does not have a television that includes a
9 captioning feature, then the community-integrated living
10 arrangement must obtain a sufficient number of televisions that
11 include a captioning feature as soon as is practicable. This
12 Section does not affect any other provision of law relating to
13 disability discrimination or providing reasonable
14 accommodations or diminish the rights of a person with a
15 disability under any other law.

16 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" or
17 "captioning" means a text display of spoken words presented on
18 a television or movie screen that allows a deaf or hard of
19 hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the action of a
20 program simultaneously."
