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1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 309

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 309, AS AMENDED, by
3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4 following:

5 "Section 5. The University of Illinois Hospital Act is
6 amended by adding Section 8b as follows:

7 (110 ILCS 330/8b new)

8 Sec. 8b. Closed captioning required. The University of
9 Illinois Hospital must make reasonable efforts to have
10 activated at all times the closed captioning feature on a
11 television in a common area provided for use by the general
12 public or in a patient's room or to enable the closed
13 captioning feature when requested to do so by a member of the
14 general public or a patient if the television includes a closed
15 captioning feature.

16 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed

1 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the University
2 of Illinois Hospital's staff after such feature is enabled in a
3 common area or in a patient's room unless the deactivation of
4 the closed captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It is
5 not a violation of this Section if the closed captioning
6 feature is deactivated by a member of the general public, a
7 patient, or a member of the University of Illinois Hospital's
8 staff at the request of a patient of the University of Illinois
9 Hospital.

10 If the University of Illinois Hospital does not have a
11 television that includes a closed captioning feature, then the
12 University of Illinois Hospital must ensure that all
13 televisions obtained for common areas and patient rooms after
14 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General
15 Assembly include a closed captioning feature. This Section does
16 not affect any other provision of law relating to disability
17 discrimination or providing reasonable accommodations or
18 diminish the rights of a person with a disability under any
19 other law.

20 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
21 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
22 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
23 action of a program simultaneously.

24 Section 10. The Alternative Health Care Delivery Act is
25 amended by adding Sections 35.5 and 7c as follows:

1 (210 ILCS 3/35.5 new)

2 Sec. 35.5. Closed captioning required. An alternative
3 health care model licensed under this Act must make reasonable
4 efforts to have activated at all times the closed captioning
5 feature on a television in a common area provided for use by
6 the general public or in a patient's room, or enable the closed
7 captioning feature when requested to do so by a member of the
8 general public or a patient, if the television includes a
9 closed captioning feature.

10 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
11 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the
12 alternative health care model's staff after such feature is
13 enabled in a common area or in a patient's room unless the
14 deactivation of the closed captioning feature is knowing or
15 intentional. It is not a violation of this Section if the
16 closed captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the
17 general public, a patient, or a member of the alternative
18 health care model's staff at the request of a patient of the
19 alternative health care model licensed under this Act.

20 If the alternative health care model licensed under this
21 Act does not have a television that includes a closed
22 captioning feature, then the alternative health care model
23 licensed under this Act must ensure that all televisions
24 obtained for common areas and patient rooms after the effective
25 date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly

1 include a closed captioning feature. This Section does not
2 affect any other provision of law relating to disability
3 discrimination or providing reasonable accommodations or
4 diminish the rights of a person with a disability under any
5 other law.

6 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
7 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
8 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
9 action of a program simultaneously.

10 Section 15. The Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act is
11 amended by adding Section 7c as follows:

12 (210 ILCS 5/7c new)

13 Sec. 7c. Closed captioning required. An ambulatory
14 surgical treatment center licensed under this Act must make
15 reasonable efforts to have activated at all times the closed
16 captioning feature on a television in a common area provided
17 for use by the general public or in a patient's room, or enable
18 the closed captioning feature when requested to do so by a
19 member of the general public or a patient, if the television
20 includes a closed captioning feature.

21 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
22 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the ambulatory
23 surgical treatment center's staff after such feature is enabled
24 in a common area or in a patient's room unless the deactivation

1 of the closed captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It
2 is not a violation of this Section if the closed captioning
3 feature is deactivated by a member of the general public, a
4 patient, or a member of the ambulatory surgical treatment
5 center's staff at the request of a patient of the ambulatory
6 surgical treatment center licensed under this Act.

7 If the ambulatory surgical treatment center licensed under
8 this Act does not have a television that includes a closed
9 captioning feature, then the ambulatory surgical treatment
10 center licensed under this Act must ensure that all televisions
11 obtained for common areas and patient rooms after the effective
12 date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly
13 include a closed captioning feature. This Section does not
14 affect any other provision of law relating to disability
15 discrimination or providing reasonable accommodations or
16 diminish the rights of a person with a disability under any
17 other law.

18 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
19 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
20 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
21 action of a program simultaneously.

22 Section 20. The Community Living Facilities Licensing Act
23 is amended by adding Section 5.5 as follows:

24 (210 ILCS 35/5.5 new)

1 Sec. 5.5. Closed captioning required. A Community Living
2 Facility licensed under this Act must make reasonable efforts
3 to have activated at all times the closed captioning feature on
4 a television in a common area provided for use by the general
5 public or in a resident's room, or enable the closed captioning
6 feature when requested to do so by a member of the general
7 public or a resident, if the television includes a closed
8 captioning feature.

9 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
10 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the Community
11 Living Facility's staff after such feature is enabled in a
12 common area or in a resident's room unless the deactivation of
13 the closed captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It is
14 not a violation of this Section if the closed captioning
15 feature is deactivated by a member of the general public, a
16 resident, or a member of the a Community Living Facility's
17 staff at the request of a resident of the Community Living
18 Facility licensed under this Act.

19 If a Community Living Facility licensed under this Act does
20 not have a television in a common area that includes a closed
21 captioning feature, then the Community Living Facility
22 licensed under this Act must ensure that all televisions
23 obtained for common areas after the effective date of this
24 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly include a closed
25 captioning feature. This Section does not affect any other
26 provision of law relating to disability discrimination or

1 providing reasonable accommodations or diminish the rights of a
2 person with a disability under any other law. Nothing in this
3 Section shall apply to televisions that are privately owned by
4 a resident or third party and not owned by the Community Living
5 Facility.

6 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
7 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
8 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
9 action of a program simultaneously.

10 Section 25. The Nursing Home Care Act is amended by adding
11 Section 3-801.2 as follows:

12 (210 ILCS 45/3-801.2 new)

13 Sec. 3-801.2. Closed captioning required. A facility
14 licensed under this Act must make reasonable efforts to have
15 activated at all times the closed captioning feature on a
16 television in a common area provided for use by the general
17 public or in a resident's room, or enable the closed captioning
18 feature when requested to do so by a member of the general
19 public or a resident, if the television includes a closed
20 captioning feature.

21 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
22 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the facility's
23 staff after such feature is enabled in a common area or in a
24 resident's room unless the deactivation of the closed

1 captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It is not a
2 violation of this Section if the closed captioning feature is
3 deactivated by a member of the general public, a resident, or a
4 member of the facility's staff at the request of a resident of
5 a facility licensed under this Act.

6 If a facility licensed under this Act does not have a
7 television in a common area that includes a closed captioning
8 feature, then the facility licensed under this Act must ensure
9 that all televisions obtained for common areas after the
10 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General
11 Assembly include a closed captioning feature. This Section does
12 not affect any other provision of law relating to disability
13 discrimination or providing reasonable accommodations or
14 diminish the rights of a person with a disability under any

24 (210 ILCS 46/3-801.2 new)

1 Sec. 3-801.2. Closed captioning required. A facility
2 licensed under this Act must make reasonable efforts to have
3 activated at all times the closed captioning feature on a
4 television in a common area provided for use by the general
5 public or in a resident's room, or enable the closed captioning
6 feature when requested to do so by a member of the general
7 public or a resident, if the television includes a closed
8 captioning feature.

9 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
10 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the facility's
11 staff after such feature is enabled in a common area or in a
12 resident's room unless the deactivation of the closed
13 captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It is not a
14 violation of this Section if the closed captioning feature is
15 deactivated by a member of the general public, a resident, or a
16 member of the facility's staff at the request of a resident of
17 a facility licensed under this Act.

18 If a facility licensed under this Act does not have a
19 television in a common area that includes a closed captioning
20 feature, then the facility licensed under this Act must ensure
21 that all televisions obtained for common areas after the
22 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General

11 Sec. 3-801.2. Closed captioning required. A facility
12 licensed under this Act must make reasonable efforts to have
13 activated at all times the closed captioning feature on a
14 television in a common area provided for use by the general
15 public or in a resident's room, or enable the closed captioning
16 feature when requested to do so by a member of the general
17 public or a resident, if the television includes a closed
18 captioning feature.

19 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
20 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the facility's
21 staff after such feature is enabled in a common area or in a
22 resident's room unless the deactivation of the closed
23 captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It is not a
24 violation of this Section if the closed captioning feature is

1 deactivated by a member of the general public, a resident, or a
2 member of the facility's staff at the request of a resident of
3 a facility licensed under this Act.

4 If a facility licensed under this Act does not have a
5 television in a common area that includes a closed captioning
6 feature, then the facility licensed under this Act must ensure
7 that all televisions obtained for common areas after the
8 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General
9 Assembly include a closed captioning feature. This Section does
10 not affect any other provision of law relating to disability

20 Section 40. The Specialized Mental Health Rehabilitation
21 Act of 2013 is amended by adding Section 2-101.5 as follows:

22 (210 ILCS 49/2-101.5 new)

23 Sec. 2-101.5. Closed captioning required. A facility
24 licensed under this Act must make reasonable efforts to have

1 activated at all times the closed captioning feature on a
2 television in a common area provided for use by the general
3 public or in a consumer's room, or enable the closed captioning
4 feature when requested to do so by a member of the general
5 public or a consumer, if the television includes a closed
6 captioning feature.

7 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
8 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the facility's
9 staff after such feature is enabled in a common area or in a
10 consumer's room unless the deactivation of the closed
11 captioning feature is knowing or intentional. It is not a
12 violation of this Section if the closed captioning feature is
13 deactivated by a member of the general public, a consumer, or a
14 member of the facility's staff at the request of a consumer of
15 a facility licensed under this Act.

16 If a facility licensed under this Act does not have a
17 television in a common area that includes a closed captioning
18 feature, then the facility licensed under this Act must ensure
19 that all televisions obtained for common areas after the
20 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General
21 Assembly include a closed captioning feature. This Section does
22 not affect any other provision of law relating to disability
23 discrimination or providing reasonable accommodations or
24 diminish the rights of a person with a disability under any
25 other law. Nothing in this Section shall apply to televisions
26 that are privately owned by a resident or third party and not

1 owned by the facility.

2 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
3 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
4 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
5 action of a program simultaneously.

6 Section 45. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by adding
7 Section 11.8 as follows:

8 (210 ILCS 85/11.8 new)

9 Sec. 11.8. Closed captioning required. A hospital licensed
10 under this Act must make reasonable efforts to have activated
11 at all times the closed captioning feature on a television in a
12 common area provided for use by the general public or in a
13 patient's room, or enable the closed captioning feature when
14 requested to do so by a member of the general public or a
15 patient, if the television includes a closed captioning
16 feature.

17 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
18 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the hospital's
19 staff after such feature is enabled in a common area or in a
20 patient's room unless the deactivation of the closed captioning
21 feature is knowing or intentional. It is not a violation of
22 this Section if the closed captioning feature is deactivated by
23 a member of the general public, a patient, or a member of the
24 hospital's staff at the request of a patient of a hospital

1 licensed under this Act.

2 If a hospital licensed under this Act does not have a
3 television that includes a closed captioning feature, then the
4 hospital must ensure that all televisions obtained for common
5 areas and patient rooms after the effective date of this
6 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly include a closed
7 captioning feature. This Section does not affect any other
8 provision of law relating to disability discrimination or
9 providing reasonable accommodations or diminish the rights of a
10 person with a disability under any other law.

11 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
12 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
13 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
14 action of a program simultaneously.

15 Section 50. The Community-Integrated Living Arrangements
16 Licensure and Certification Act is amended by adding Section
17 10.5 as follows:

18 (210 ILCS 135/10.5 new)

19 Sec. 10.5. Closed captioning required. A
20 community-integrated living arrangement certified under this
21 Act must make reasonable efforts to have activated at all times
22 the closed captioning feature on a television in a common area
23 provided for use by the general public or in a resident's room,
24 or enable the closed captioning feature when requested to do so

1 by a member of the general public or a resident, if the
2 television includes a closed captioning feature.

3 It is not a violation of this Section if the closed
4 captioning feature is deactivated by a member of the
5 community-integrated living arrangement's staff after such
6 feature is enabled in a common area or in a resident's room
7 unless the deactivation of the closed captioning feature is
8 knowing or intentional. It is not a violation of this Section
9 if the closed captioning feature is deactivated by a member of
10 the general public, a resident, or a member of the
11 community-integrated living arrangement's staff at the request
12 of a resident of a community-integrated living arrangement
13 certified under this Act.

14 If a community-integrated living arrangement certified
15 under this Act does not have a television in a common area that
16 includes a closed captioning feature, then the
17 community-integrated living arrangement certified under this
18 Act must ensure that all televisions obtained for common areas
19 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th
20 General Assembly include a closed captioning feature. This
21 Section does not affect any other provision of law relating to
22 disability discrimination or providing reasonable
23 accommodations or diminish the rights of a person with a
24 disability under any other law. Nothing in this Section shall
25 apply to televisions that are privately owned by a resident or
26 third party and not owned by the community-integrated living

1 arrangement.

2 As used in this Section, "closed captioning" means a text
3 display of spoken words presented on a television that allows a
4 deaf or hard of hearing viewer to follow the dialogue and the
5 action of a program simultaneously."
