### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/3-616

from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-616

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that upon receiving an application for a certificate of registration for a motor vehicle of the first division or for a motor vehicle of the second division weighing no more than 8,000 pounds, accompanied with payment of required registration fees, the Secretary of State shall, if requested, issue certain registration plates with an imprinted and reasonably recognizable international accessibility symbol for a person with disabilities or a person who is deaf or hard of hearing, if certain conditions are met.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 3-616 as follows:

7 Sec. 3-616. Disability license plates.

(a) Upon receiving an application for a certificate of 8 9 registration for a motor vehicle of the first division or for a 10 motor vehicle of the second division weighing no more than 8,000 pounds, accompanied with payment of the registration fees 11 12 required under this Code from a person with disabilities or a 13 person who is deaf or hard of hearing, the Secretary of State, 14 if so requested, shall issue to such person registration plates as provided for in Section 3-611 or, if so requested, 15 16 registration plates authorized under Article IV or Article VI 17 of this Chapter with a reasonably recognizable international accessibility symbol imprinted on the plates, provided that the 18 19 person with disabilities or person who is deaf or hard of 20 hearing must not be disqualified from obtaining a driver's 21 license under subsection 8 of Section 6-103 of this Code and is 22 otherwise qualified to receive the particular registration plates requested, and further provided that any person making 23

such a request must submit a statement, certified by a licensed 1 2 physician, by a licensed physician assistant, or by a licensed 3 advanced practice nurse, to the effect that such person is a person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 of this 4 5 Code, or alternatively provide adequate documentation that such person has a Class 1A, Class 2A or Type Four disability 6 provisions of 7 under the Section 4A of the Illinois 8 Identification Card Act. For purposes of this Section, an 9 Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card issued 10 pursuant to the Illinois Identification Card Act indicating 11 that the person thereon named has a disability shall be 12 adequate documentation of such a disability.

13 (b) The Secretary shall issue plates under this Section to 14 a parent or legal guardian of a person with disabilities if the 15 person with disabilities has a Class 1A or Class 2A disability 16 as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card 17 Act or is a person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 of this Code, and does not possess a vehicle registered 18 19 in his or her name, provided that the person with disabilities 20 relies frequently on the parent or legal quardian for transportation. Only one vehicle per family may be registered 21 22 under this subsection, unless the applicant can justify in 23 writing the need for one additional set of plates. Any person requesting special plates under this subsection shall submit 24 25 such documentation or such physician's, physician assistant's, 26 or advanced practice nurse's statement as is required in

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subsection (a) and a statement describing the circumstances qualifying for issuance of special plates under this subsection. An optometrist may certify a Class 2A Visual Disability, as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act, for the purpose of qualifying a person with disabilities for special plates under this subsection.

7 (c) The Secretary may issue a parking decal or device to a 8 person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 without 9 regard to qualification of such person with disabilities for a 10 driver's license or registration of a vehicle by such person 11 with disabilities or such person's immediate family, provided 12 such person with disabilities making such a request has been 13 issued an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card 14 indicating that the person named thereon has a Class 1A or 15 Class 2A disability, or alternatively, submits a statement 16 certified by a licensed physician, or by a licensed physician 17 assistant or a licensed advanced practice nurse as provided in subsection (a), to the effect that such person is a person with 18 disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1. An optometrist may 19 20 certify a Class 2A Visual Disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act for the purpose of 21 22 qualifying a person with disabilities for a parking decal or 23 device under this subsection.

(d) The Secretary shall prescribe by rules and regulations
 procedures to certify or re-certify as necessary the
 eligibility of persons whose disabilities are other than

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permanent for special plates or parking decals or devices 1 2 issued under subsections (a), (b) and (c). Except as provided under subsection (f) of this Section, no such special plates, 3 decals or devices shall be issued by the Secretary of State to 4 5 or on behalf of any person with disabilities unless such person is certified as meeting the definition of a person with 6 7 disabilities pursuant to Section 1-159.1 or meeting the 8 requirement of a Type Four disability as provided under Section 9 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act for the period of 10 time that the physician, or the physician assistant or advanced 11 practice nurse as provided in subsection (a), determines the 12 applicant will have the disability, but not to exceed 6 months 13 from the date of certification or recertification.

(e) Any person requesting special plates under this Section
may also apply to have the special plates personalized, as
provided under Section 3-405.1.

17 (f) The Secretary of State, upon application, shall issue disability registration plates or 18 а parking decal to corporations, school districts, State or municipal agencies, 19 20 limited liability companies, nursing homes, convalescent homes, or special education cooperatives which will transport 21 22 persons with disabilities. The Secretary shall prescribe by 23 rule a means to certify or re-certify the eligibility of organizations to receive disability plates or decals and to 24 25 designate which of the 2 person with disabilities emblems shall 26 be placed on qualifying vehicles.

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1 (q) The Secretary of State, or his designee, may enter into 2 agreements with other jurisdictions, including foreign jurisdictions, on behalf of this State relating to the 3 extension of parking privileges by such jurisdictions to 4 5 residents of this State with disabilities who display a special 6 license plate or parking device that contains the International 7 symbol of access on his or her motor vehicle, and to recognize such plates or devices issued by such other jurisdictions. This 8 9 State shall grant the same parking privileges which are granted disabilities 10 to residents of this State with to anv 11 non-resident whose motor vehicle is licensed in another state, 12 district, territory or foreign country if such vehicle displays 13 the international symbol of access or a distinguishing insignia on license plates or parking device issued in accordance with 14 the laws of the non-resident's state, district, territory or 15 16 foreign country.
