### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-6

from Ch. 122, par. 27-6

Amends the School Code. Authorizes a school board to excuse pupils enrolled in grades 9 through 12 (instead of grades 11 and 12) from engaging in physical education courses if those pupils request to be excused for any of specified reasons. Effective July 1, 2017.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
27-6 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/27-6) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-6)

Sec. 27-6. Courses in physical education required; special
activities.

9 (a) Pupils enrolled in the public schools and State universities engaged in preparing teachers shall be required to 10 engage daily during the school day, except on block scheduled 11 12 days for those public schools engaged in block scheduling, in 13 courses of physical education for such periods as are 14 compatible with the optimum growth and developmental needs of individuals at the various age levels except when appropriate 15 16 excuses are submitted to the school by a pupil's parent or guardian or by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act 17 of 1987 and except as provided in subsection (b) of this 18 19 Section.

20 Special activities in physical education shall be provided 21 for pupils whose physical or emotional condition, as determined 22 by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, 23 prevents their participation in the courses provided for normal - 2 - LRB100 09188 NHT 19343 b

2 (b) A school board is authorized to excuse pupils enrolled in grades 9 through <del>11 and</del> 12 from engaging in physical 3 education courses if those pupils request to be excused for any 4 5 of the following reasons: (1) for ongoing participation in an interscholastic athletic program; (2) to enroll in academic 6 7 classes which are required for admission to an institution of higher learning, provided that failure to take such classes 8 9 will result in the pupil being denied admission to the institution of his or her choice; or (3) to enroll in academic 10 11 classes which are required for graduation from high school, 12 provided that failure to take such classes will result in the 13 pupil being unable to graduate. A school board may also excuse 14 pupils in grades 9 through 12 enrolled in a marching band 15 program for credit from engaging in physical education courses if those pupils request to be excused for ongoing participation 16 17 in such marching band program. In addition, a pupil in any of grades 3 through 12 who is eligible for special education may 18 be excused if the pupil's parent or guardian agrees that the 19 20 pupil must utilize the time set aside for physical education to receive special education support and services or, if there is 21 22 no agreement, the individualized education program team for the 23 pupil determines that the pupil must utilize the time set aside for physical education to receive special education support and 24 25 services, which agreement or determination must be made a part 26 of the individualized education program. However, a pupil

requiring adapted physical education must receive that service 1 2 in accordance with the individualized education program 3 developed for the pupil. If requested, a school board is authorized to excuse a pupil from engaging in a physical 4 5 education course if the pupil has an individualized educational program under Article 14 of this Code, is participating in an 6 adaptive athletic program outside of the school setting, and 7 8 documents such participation as determined by the school board. 9 A school board may also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 10 enrolled in a Reserve Officer's Training Corps (ROTC) program 11 sponsored by the school district from engaging in physical 12 education courses. School boards which choose to exercise this 13 authority shall establish a policy to excuse pupils on an individual basis. 14

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2017.

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
