Amend Senate Bill 1427 by replacing 2 everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing 4 Sections 3 and 7.12 as follows: 5 6 (20 ILCS 1605/3) (from Ch. 120, par. 1153) 7 Sec. 3. For the purposes of this Act: a. "Lottery" or "State Lottery" means the lottery, or 8 lotteries, or the policy game commonly known as keno as 10 established and operated pursuant to this Act. b. "Board" means the Lottery Control Board created by this 11 12 Act. c. "Department" means the Department of the Lottery. 13 d. (Blank). 14 e. "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Lottery Control 15 Board. 16

- (a) The General Assembly finds that: 11
- 12 (1) the consumer market in Illinois has changed since
- 13 the creation of the Illinois State Lottery in 1974;
- 14 (2) the Internet has become an integral part of
- everyday life for a significant number of Illinois 15
- 16 residents not only in regards to their professional life,
- 17 but also in regards to personal business and communication;
- 18 and
- 19 (3) the current practices of selling lottery tickets
- 20 does not appeal to the new form of market participants who
- 21 prefer to make purchases on the Internet at their own
- 22 convenience.
- It is the intent of the General Assembly to create an 23
- 24 Internet program for the sale of lottery tickets to capture
- this new form of market participant. 25

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(b) The Department shall create a program that allows an individual 18 years of age or older to purchase lottery tickets or shares on the Internet without using a Lottery retailer with on-line status, as those terms are defined by rule. Department shall restrict the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet to transactions initiated and received or otherwise made exclusively within the State of Illinois. The Department shall adopt rules necessary for the administration of this program. These rules shall include, among other things, requirements for marketing of the Lottery to infrequent players, as well as limitations on the purchases that may be made through any one individual's lottery account. provisions of this Act and the rules adopted under this Act shall apply to the sale of lottery tickets or shares under this program.

The Department may offer Lotto, Lucky Day Lotto, Mega Millions, Powerball, Pick 3, Pick 4, and other draw games that are offered at retail locations, as well as interactive instant win games, through the Internet program. The private manager shall obtain the Director's approval before providing any draw games or interactive instant win games and must submit the following information with the Director: the rationale for introducing the draw games or interactive instant win games, the consumer research on the target market, and the amount of net profit that is expected. Any games that are approved for sale by Lottery retail licensees are automatically approved for

## sale on the Internet.

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Before beginning the program, the Department of the Lottery must submit a request to the United States Department of Justice for review of the State's plan to implement a program for the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet and its propriety under federal law. The Department shall implement the Internet program only if the Department of Justice does not object to the implementation of the program within a reasonable period of time after its review.

The Department is obligated to implement the program set forth in this Section and Sections 7.15 and 7.16 only at such time, and to such extent, that the Department of Justice does not object to the implementation of the program within a reasonable period of time after its review. While the Illinois Lottery may only offer Lotto, Mega Millions, and Powerball games through the program, the Department shall request review from the federal Department of Justice for the Illinois Lottery to sell lottery tickets on the Internet on behalf of the State of Illinois that are not limited to just these games.

The Department shall authorize the private manager to implement and administer the program pursuant to the management agreement entered into under Section 9.1 and in a manner consistent with the provisions of this Section. If a private manager has not been selected pursuant to Section 9.1 at the time the Department is obligated to implement the program or has been terminated pursuant to Section 9.1, then the

The Department may continue offering Lotto, Mega 8 9 Millions, and Powerball prior to the selection of a private
  - Nothing in this Section shall be construed as prohibiting the Department from implementing and operating a website portal whereby individuals who are 18 years of age or older with an Illinois mailing address may apply to purchase lottery tickets via subscription. Nothing in this Section shall also be construed as prohibiting the sale of Lotto, Mega Millions, and Powerball, Lucky Day Lotto, Pick 3, or Pick 4 games by a lottery licensee pursuant to the Department's rules.
