1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1427

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 1427 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing
5 Section 7.12 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 1605/7.12)

7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on July 1, 2017)

8 Sec. 7.12. Internet program.

9 (a) The General Assembly finds that:

10 (1) the consumer market in Illinois has changed since
11 the creation of the Illinois State Lottery in 1974;

12 (2) the Internet has become an integral part of
13 everyday life for a significant number of Illinois
14 residents not only in regards to their professional life,
15 but also in regards to personal business and communication;
16 and

1 (3) the current practices of selling lottery tickets
2 does not appeal to the new form of market participants who
3 prefer to make purchases on the Internet at their own
4 convenience.

5 It is the intent of the General Assembly to create an
6 Internet program for the sale of lottery tickets to capture
7 this new form of market participant.

8 (b) The Department shall create a program that allows an
9 individual 18 years of age or older to purchase lottery tickets
10 or shares on the Internet without using a Lottery retailer with
11 on-line status, as those terms are defined by rule. The
12 Department shall restrict the sale of lottery tickets on the
13 Internet to transactions initiated and received or otherwise
14 made exclusively within the State of Illinois. The Department
15 shall adopt rules necessary for the administration of this
16 program. These rules shall include, among other things,
17 requirements for marketing of the Lottery to infrequent
18 players, as well as limitations on the purchases that may be
19 made through any one individual's lottery account. The
20 provisions of this Act and the rules adopted under this Act
21 shall apply to the sale of lottery tickets or shares under this
22 program.

23 Before beginning the program, the Department of the Lottery
24 must submit a request to the United States Department of
25 Justice for review of the State's plan to implement a program
26 for the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet and its

1 propriety under federal law. The Department shall implement the
2 Internet program only if the Department of Justice does not
3 object to the implementation of the program within a reasonable
4 period of time after its review.

5 The Department is obligated to implement the program set
6 forth in this Section and Sections 7.15 and 7.16 only at such
7 time, and to such extent, that the Department of Justice does
8 not object to the implementation of the program within a
9 reasonable period of time after its review. While the Illinois
10 Lottery may only offer Lotto, Mega Millions, and Powerball
11 games through the program, the Department shall request review
12 from the federal Department of Justice for the Illinois Lottery
13 to sell lottery tickets on the Internet on behalf of the State
14 of Illinois that are not limited to just these games.

15 The Department shall authorize the private manager to
16 implement and administer the program pursuant to the management
17 agreement entered into under Section 9.1 and in a manner
18 consistent with the provisions of this Section. If a private
19 manager has not been selected pursuant to Section 9.1 at the
20 time the Department is obligated to implement the program, then
21 the Department shall not proceed with the program until after
22 the selection of the private manager, at which time the
23 Department shall authorize the private manager to implement and
24 administer the program pursuant to the management agreement
25 entered into under Section 9.1 and in a manner consistent with
26 the provisions of this Section.

1 Nothing in this Section shall be construed as prohibiting
2 the Department from implementing and operating a website portal
3 whereby individuals who are 18 years of age or older with an
4 Illinois mailing address may apply to purchase lottery tickets
5 via subscription. Nothing in this Section shall also be
6 construed as prohibiting the sale of Lotto, Mega Millions, and
7 Powerball games by a lottery licensee pursuant to the
8 Department's rules.
