AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 3-414.1 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/3-414.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-414.1)

Sec. 3-414.1. Term of multi-year registration plates.

(a) Registration plates issued for motor vehicles shall be 8 9 valid for an indefinite term of not less than one year. Registration plates issued as two-year or five-year plates may 10 be issued as multi-year plates at the discretion of the 11 Secretary of State. Current renewal registration stickers, 12 when necessary, are to be attached as provided in Section 13 14 3-413. The Secretary may in his discretion prescribe a term greater than one year or may extend the term of current 15 16 registration plates for an additional calendar year by 17 appropriate public announcement made before August 1 of the current registration year. 18

19 <u>(a-5)</u> Beginning with the 2019 registration year, the 20 Secretary shall offer to each owner of a motor vehicle of the 21 first division or motor vehicle of the second division weighing 22 no more than 8,000 pounds that is subject to registration under 23 this Chapter a registration period based on a one calendar SB1505 Engrossed - 2 - LRB100 11143 AXK 21424 b

year, 2 calendar year, 3 calendar year, 4 calendar year, or 5 1 calendar year basis. The owner of the motor vehicle shall pay a 2 3 one-time registration fee under Section 3-806, 3-815, or 3-818 4 of this Code that shall, if applicable, be increased to reflect 5 the registration year period chosen by the motor vehicle owner. 6 (b) Registration plates issued to owners of vehicles 7 subject to annual registration for the first time during the term of the plates shall be valid until the expiration of the 8 9 term. Current annual registration stickers are to be attached 10 as provided in Section 3-413.
