For campsites without access to showers or electricity, no camping fee authorized by this Section shall be 23

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1 charged to any resident of Illinois who has a Class 2 2 defined in Section 4A of the disability as Illinois 3 Identification Card Act. For campsites without access to showers or electricity, no camping fee authorized by this 4 5 Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois who is age 62 or older for the use of a campsite unit during the period 6 7 Monday through Thursday of any week. No camping fee authorized 8 by this Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois 9 who is a veteran with a disability or a former prisoner of war, 10 as defined in Section 5 of the Department of Veterans' Veterans 11 Affairs Act. No camping fee authorized by this Section shall be 12 charged to any resident of Illinois after returning from 13 service abroad or mobilization by the President of the United States as an active duty member of the United States Armed 14 Forces, the Illinois National Guard, or the Reserves of the 15 16 United States Armed Forces for the amount of time that the 17 active duty member spent in service abroad or mobilized if the person (i) applies for a pass at the Department office in 18 Springfield within 2 years after returning and provides 19 20 acceptable verification of service or mobilization to the Department or (ii) applies for a pass at a Regional Office of 21 22 the Department within 2 years after returning and provides 23 acceptable verification of service or mobilization to the Department; any portion of a year that the active duty member 24 25 spent in service abroad or mobilized shall count as a full year. Nonresidents shall be charged the same fees as are 26

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authorized for the general public regardless of age. The Department shall provide by regulation for suitable proof of age, or either a valid driver's license or a "Golden Age Passport" issued by the federal government shall be acceptable as proof of age. The Department shall further provide by regulation that notice of these reduced admission fees be posted in a conspicuous place and manner.

8 Reduced fees authorized in this Section shall not apply to9 any charge for utility service.

10 For the purposes of this Section, "acceptable verification 11 of service or mobilization" means official documentation from 12 the Department of Defense or the appropriate Major Command 13 showing mobilization dates or service abroad dates, including: 14 (i) a DD-214, (ii) a letter from the Illinois Department of 15 Military Affairs for members of the Illinois National Guard, 16 (iii) a letter from the Regional Reserve Command for members of 17 the Armed Forces Reserve, (iv) a letter from the Major Command covering Illinois for active duty members, (v) personnel 18 19 records for mobilized State employees, and (vi) any other 20 documentation that the Department, by administrative rule, deems acceptable to establish dates of mobilization or service 21 22 abroad.

For the purposes of this Section, the term "service abroad" means active duty service outside of the 50 United States and the District of Columbia, and includes all active duty service in territories and possessions of the United States.
