The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may 10 be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Underground 11 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for a grant to the Statewide One-call 12 13 Notice System, as required in the Illinois Underground Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Act. 14
- Section 15. The sum of \$1,000, or so much thereof as may 15 16 be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Underground Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois 17 Commerce Commission for refunds. 18
- 19 Section 25. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as 20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless Carrier 21 Reimbursement Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for 22 reimbursement of wireless carriers for costs incurred in

- Section 35. The sum of \$4,240,000, or so much thereof as 1 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for (1) 3 disbursing funds collected for the Single State Insurance 4 5 Registration Program and/or Unified Carrier Registration 6 System; (2) for refunds for overpayments; and (3) for 7 administrative expenses.
- 8 Section 45. The sum of \$4,400,000, or so much thereof as 9 necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois 10 Telecommunications Access Corporation Fund to the Illinois 11 Commerce Commission for administrative costs and 12 distribution to the Illinois Telecommunications Access Corporation, as required in the Illinois Public Utilities Act, 13 14 Section 13-703.
- 15 Section 50. No contract shall be entered into or obligation 16 incurred or any expenditure made from the appropriation herein 17 made in Section 40 of this Article until after the purpose and 18 the amount of such expenditure has been approved in writing by the Governor. 19
- Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July 20 1, 2017, if and only if Senate Bill 2063 of the 100th General 21

- 1 Assembly (the Unbalanced Budget Response Act), as introduced
- 2 in the Illinois Senate, becomes law.
