A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 0.2

5 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and
6 reappropriations for State fiscal year 2017. Articles 1, 4,
7 5, 6, 10, 14, 16, 24, 25, and 27 contain reappropriations of
8 certain appropriations as may have been appropriated for State
9 fiscal year 2017 by a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly.
10 To the extent that such a Public Act has not been enacted,
11 Articles 33 through 42 contain appropriations of identical
12 amounts and purposes to those in Articles 1, 4, 5, 6, 10, 14,
13 16, 24, 25, and 27 but as new appropriations rather than as
14 reappropriations. Section 99 of Article 99 sets forth an
15 effective date that causes Articles 1, 4, 5, 6, 10, 14, 16, 24,
16 25, and 27 to become effective if, and only if, an applicable
17 Public Act of the 100th General Assembly should be enacted;
18 should such not be enacted, the Section causes Articles 33
19 through 42 to become effective.

20 ARTICLE 0.5

21 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a

1 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
2 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
3 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
4 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
5 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
6 and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed
7 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by
8 the State.

9 ARTICLE 1

10 SECRETARY OF STATE

11 Section 1. The sum of \$10,110,140, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
13 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
14 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
15 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
16 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Secretary of State for
17 capital grants to public libraries for permanent improvements.

18 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
19 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
20 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
21 been approved in writing by the Governor.

22 Total, this Article \$10,110,140

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ARTICLE 2

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Section 1. The following named amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and capital improvements including construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities, cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services and all other expenses required to complete the work:

For various projects at the Illinois

ARTICLE 3

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

Section 1. The sum of \$11,475,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2017, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 163.5, Section 5 of Public Act 99-0524, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the

1 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to
2 local governments for capital improvements to civic centers.

3 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
4 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
5 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
6 been approved in writing by the Governor.

7 Total, this Article \$11,475,000

8 ARTICLE 4

9 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

10 Section 1. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
14 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
15 from the Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department
16 of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans
17 associated with the Port Development Revolving Loan Program
18 pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

19 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
2 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
3 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
4 and Economic Opportunity a grant to the Uptown Theatre for
5 costs associated with capital improvements.

6 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
9 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
10 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
11 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
12 and Economic Opportunity for grants associated with the
13 redevelopment of Brownfield sites.

14 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
16 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
17 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
18 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
19 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
20 and Economic Opportunity for grants associated with the
21 redevelopment of brownfield sites.

22 Section 20. The sum of \$1,052,757, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
2 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
3 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
4 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
5 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce
6 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Medical
7 District Commission for capital improvements, acquisition and
8 development of land and structures, including previously
9 incurred costs.

10 Section 25. The sum of \$12,386,633, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
14 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
15 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
16 and Economic Opportunity for a grant for the Illinois Science
17 and Technology Park.

18 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
22 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
23 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce

1 and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not
2 limited to Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build
3 Illinois Act.

4 Section 35. The sum of \$75,338,451, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
6 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
7 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
8 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
9 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
10 and Economic Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and
11 loans to local governments for planning, engineering,
12 acquisition, construction, reconstruction, development,
13 improvement and extension of the public infrastructure, and for
14 any other purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4
15 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies
16 for such purposes.

17 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
19 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
20 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
21 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
22 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
23 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Medical

1 District Commission for the purpose of fostering economic
2 development and increased employment and the well being of the
3 citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
4 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and
5 for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 45. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
9 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
10 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
11 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
12 and Economic Opportunity for purposes authorized in subsection
13 (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants
14 to State agencies for such purposes.

15 Section 50. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
18 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
19 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
20 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce
21 and Economic Opportunity for deposits into the Partners for
22 Conservation Projects Fund and other purposes authorized by
23 subsection (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act

1 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 55. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
4 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
5 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
6 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
7 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce
8 and Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for
9 the acquisition, financing, architectural planning,
10 development, alteration, installation, and construction of
11 capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
12 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section
13 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State
14 agencies for such purposes.

15 Section 60. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
18 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
19 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
20 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce
21 and Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for
22 the acquisition, financing, architectural planning,
23 development, alteration, installation, and construction of

1 capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
2 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section
3 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State
4 agencies for such purposes.

5 Section 65. The sum of \$1,195,268, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
7 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
8 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
9 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
10 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce
11 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Chicago Housing
12 Authority for LeClaire Courts.

13 Section 70. The sum of \$398,974,111, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose from such fund to such agency in such
17 amount above in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is
18 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
19 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
20 awarded under the Urban Weatherization Initiative Act.

21 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314 or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
3 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
4 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
5 and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans including but not
6 limited to broadband deployment to expand and strengthen
7 existing broadband network infrastructure, health information
8 technology, telemedicine, distance learning, and public safety.

9 Section 80. The sum of \$15,080,745, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
13 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
14 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
15 and Economic Opportunity for infrastructure projects that lead
16 directly to private sector expansion or retention activities
17 including but not limited to public infrastructure construction
18 and renovation, financing for the purchase of land and
19 buildings, construction or renovation of fixed assets, site
20 preparation and purchase of machinery and equipment.

21 Section 85. The sum of \$2,330,884, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
23 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
2 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
3 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
4 and Economic Opportunity for the requirements necessary to
5 leverage capital-related American Recovery and Reinvestment Act
6 of 2009 funds of equal or greater value in order to make
7 Illinois or Illinois applicants more competitive and/or for
8 costs associated with bondable improvements to match federal,
9 local, private or other funds.

10 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
11 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
14 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
15 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
16 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Phoenix Foundation
17 of Southern Illinois for hospital renovation and equipment.

18 Section 95. The sum of \$2,978,788, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
22 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
23 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce

1 and Economic Opportunity for grants associated with the
2 redevelopment of Brownfield sites.

3 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose from such fund to such agency in such
7 amount above in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is
8 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the

3 Section 105. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
5 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
6 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
7 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
8 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
9 and Economic Opportunity for grants for acquisition,
10 construction, renovation and equipping new charter schools, to
11 a silver certification from the United States Green Building
12 Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Green
13 Building Rating System as approximated below:

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15 Section 110. The sum of \$2,606,686, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

4 Section 125. The sum of \$2,084,459 or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
6 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
7 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
8 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
9 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
10 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to Community Health and
11 Emergency Services, Inc. for the construction of a hospital
12 wing at the Cairo Megaclinic.

13 Section 130. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
15 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
16 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
17 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
18 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
19 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Cook County Health
20 and Hospital System for costs associated with medical equipment
21 and capital improvements at Provident Hospital.

22 Section 135. This Article is not subject to limitations

1 under Section 5 of Article 48 of Public Act 95-734 or any
2 similar limitation.

3 Section 140. No contract shall be entered into or
4 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
5 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
6 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
7 Governor.

10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 1. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as may
12 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
13 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
14 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
15 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
16 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
17 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to Erie Neighborhood
18 House.

19 Section 5. The sum of \$338,579, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
 2 in a Public Act of the 100th General Assembly, is reappropriated
 3 from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce
 4 and Economic Opportunity for a grant to Family Guidance Center.

5 Section 10. This Article is not subject to limitations
 6 under Section 5 of Article 48 of Public Act 95-734 or any
 7 similar limitation.

8 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
 9 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
 10 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
 11 been approved in writing by the Governor.

12 Total, this Article \$1,088,579

14 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

15 Section 1. Appropriations to the Department of Natural
 16 Resources in Articles 7 through 10 and Article 36 may be used
 17 for costs incurred prior to July 1, 2017.

18 ARTICLE 7

19 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

20 Section 1. The sum of \$35,000,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for capital grants
3 to parks or recreational units for improvements.

4 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
5 incurred or any expenditure made from an appropriation herein
6 made in this Article until after the purpose and amount of such
7 expenditure has been approved in writing by the Governor.

8 Total, this article 35,000,000

9 ARTICLE 8

10 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

11 Section 1. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may
12 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
13 to the Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
14 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the Agency's
15 operational expenses.

16 Section 5. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as may
17 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
18 to the Department of Natural Resources for the administration
19 and payment of grants to local governmental units for the
20 construction, maintenance, and improvement of boat access
21 areas.

1 Section 10. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as may
2 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
3 to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the
4 Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
5 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
6 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
7 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
8 areas.

9 Section 15. To the extent federal funds including
10 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
11 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated
12 from the State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural
13 Resources for all costs for construction and development of
14 facilities for transient, non-trailerable recreational boats,
15 including grants for such purposes and authorized under the
16 Boating Infrastructure Grant Program.

17 Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
19 hereinafter named, are appropriated to the Department of
20 Natural Resources:

21 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

22 For multiple use facilities and programs

1 for boating purposes provided by the
 2 Department of Natural Resources,
 3 including construction and development,
 4 all costs for supplies, materials,
 5 labor, land acquisition, services, studies
 6 and all other expenses required to comply
 7 with the intent of this appropriation3,000,000

8 Payable from State Parks Fund:

9 For multiple use facilities and programs
 10 for park and trail purposes provided by
 11 the Department of Natural Resources, including
 12 construction and development, all costs
 13 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 14 acquisition, services, studies, and
 15 all other expenses required to comply with
 16 the intent of this appropriation150,000

17 Section 25. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
 18 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund
 19 to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition and
 20 development, including grants, for the implementation of the
 21 North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion
 22 of Canada or the United States which specifically provides
 23 waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

1 Section 30. To the extent federal funds including
 2 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 3 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 4 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department
 5 of Natural Resources for construction and renovation of waste
 6 reception facilities for recreational boaters, including grants
 7 for such purposes authorized under the Clean Vessel Act.

8 Section 35. The following named sum, or so much thereof
 9 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 10 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government or
 11 any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or political
 12 subdivision of the State, or with any public or private
 13 corporation, organization, or individual, is appropriated to
 14 the Department of Natural Resources for refunds and the
 15 purposes stated:

16 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
16 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency to provide loans
17 and grants for the modification, alteration, or retrofitting
18 of renewable fuel plants in Illinois in order to encourage the
19 implementation of technologies that increase the overall
20 efficiency of the renewable fuel production process or reduce
21 the life-cycle greenhouse gas emissions of the renewable fuel
22 produced including, but not limited to: (i) improved water

9 loans for transportation electrification infrastructure
10 projects; including, but not limited to grants and loans for
11 the purpose of encouraging electric car manufacturing and
12 infrastructure for electric vehicles.

13 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
14 incurred for any expenditure made in this Article until after
15 the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
16 Governor.
