SB3529

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 1605/7.12

Amends the Illinois Lottery Law. Allows the Department of the Lottery to offer Lotto, Lucky Day Lotto, Mega Millions, Powerball, Pick 3, Pick 4, and other draw games that are offered at retail locations, as well as interactive instant win games, through the Internet program. Requires the private manager to obtain the Director of the Lottery's approval before providing any draw games or interactive instant win games. Provides that any games that are approved for sale by Lottery retail licensees are automatically approved for sale on the Internet. Removes certain provisions concerning the Department of the Lottery submitting a request to the United States Department of Justice to review the State's plan to implement the Internet program. Removes provisions prohibiting the Department from proceeding with the Internet program until a private manager is selected. Effective immediately.

## A BILL FOR

AN ACT concerning State government.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing Section 7.12 as follows:
(20 ILCS 1605/7.12)
(Section scheduled to be repealed on July 1, 2018)
Sec. 7.12. Internet program.
(a) The General Assembly finds that:
(1) the consumer market in Illinois has changed since the creation of the Illinois State Lottery in 1974;
(2) the Internet has become an integral part of everyday life for a significant number of Illinois residents not only in regards to their professional life, but also in regards to personal business and communication; and
(3) the current practices of selling lottery tickets does not appeal to the new form of market participants who prefer to make purchases on the Internet at their own convenience.

It is the intent of the General Assembly to create an Internet program for the sale of lottery tickets to capture this new form of market participant.
(b) The Department shall create a program that allows an individual 18 years of age or older to purchase lottery tickets or shares on the Internet without using a Lottery retailer with on-line status, as those terms are defined by rule. The Department shall restrict the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet to transactions initiated and received or otherwise made exclusively within the State of Illinois. The Department shall adopt rules necessary for the administration of this program. These rules shall include, among other things, requirements for marketing of the Lottery to infrequent players, as well as limitations on the purchases that may be made through any one individual's lottery account. The provisions of this Act and the rules adopted under this Act shall apply to the sale of lottery tickets or shares under this program.

The Department may offer Lotto, Lucky Day Lotto, Mega Millions, Powerball, Pick 3, Pick 4, and other draw games that are offered at retail locations, as well as interactive instant win games, through the Internet program. The private manager shall obtain the Director's approval before providing any draw games or interactive instant win games. Any games that are approved for sale by Lottery retail licensees are automatically approved for sale on the Internet.

Before beginning the program, the Department of the Iot tery must submit a request to the United States Department of
for the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet and its
propriety undex federal law. The Department shall implement the
Internet program only if the Department of Justice does not
ebject to the implementation of the program within a reasonable
period of time after its review.
The Department is obligated to implement the program set
forth in this section and sections 7.15 and 7.16 only at sueh
time, and to such extent, that the Department of Justice does
not object to the implementation of the program within a
reasonable period of time after its review. While the Illinois
fottery may only offer Iotto, Mega Millions, and powerball
games through the program, the Department shall request review
from the federal Department of Justice for the Illinois Lotery
tosell lotery tickets on the Internet on behalf of the state
ef Illinois that are not limited to just these games.
The Department shall authorize the private manager to
implement and administer the program pursuant to the management
agreement entered into under Section 9.1 and in a manner
consistent with the provisions of this Section. If a private
managex has not been selected pursuant to section 9.1 at the
time the Department is obligated to implement the program, then
the Department shall not proced with the program until aftex
the selection of the private manager, at which time the
Department shall authorize the private manager to implement and
administer the program pursuant to the management agreement
entered into under section 9.1 and in a manner consistent with
the provisions of this section.
Nothing in this Section shall be construed as prohibiting the Department from implementing and operating a website portal whereby individuals who are 18 years of age or older with an Illinois mailing address may apply to purchase lottery tickets via subscription. Nothing in this Section shall also be construed as prohibiting the sale of Lotto, Mega Millions, Powerball, Lucky Day Lotto, Pick 3, or Pick 4 or any other draw number games previously approved by the Lottery and actively sold in licensed retail locations. games by lotery liensee pursuant to the Department's xules.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
