WHEREAS, Paul Hendren was born at Fort Riley, Kansas to Dr. William Paul and Nancy Grosboll Hendren on September 28, 1942; his family settled in Carthage in 1952; he graduated from the University of Illinois in 1964 with honors in sociology, where he was a member of the Delta Upsilon fraternity and was business manager of the Illio yearbook; he graduated from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign College of Law in 1967, where he wrote for the Law Review and was named to the Order of the Coif honorary; he served four years in the United States Army JAG Corps, which included service in Vietnam; he married Suzanne Backs in Belvidere on June 13, 1965; and
