1 SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to 3 learn of the death of Edward F. Waszak of Crystal Lake, who 4 passed away on July 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, Edward Waszak was born Hammond, Indiana to Frank and Clara (Przystas); he was inducted into the United States Army immediately upon graduation from high school; after basic training, he was admitted into the Army Specialized Training Program and was sent to Socorro, New Mexico to study engineering at the New Mexico School of Mines; and

WHEREAS, Edward Waszak was attached to the 12th Armored Division and was sent to Strasbourg, France; he landed in Europe just in time to begin preparations for the pivotal battle that would later be remembered as "Bloody Herlssheim"; during the retreat, he was captured by the German army and spent the remainder of the war as a prisoner of war in Stalag XI-B; and

WHEREAS, After the war, Edward Waszak completed his chemical engineering degree at Purdue University; he took his first engineering job at American Maize in Hammond, Indiana, where he met his wife, Therese (Krysinski); in 1965, he began what would be a nearly 30-year career at the Morton Chemical

- around the world more times than he cared to count; he went

Company; he worked his way up through the ranks which took him

- 3 from plant manager to executive vice president before his
- 4 retirement in 1994; and
- 5 WHEREAS, After retirement, Edward Waszak reconnected with 6 the 12th Armored Division Association, intent on understanding 7 the events he experienced as a young soldier from the vantage point of age and maturity; he voraciously read accounts and 8 9 biographies of those involved in the war's decision-making 10 processes; he became the 12th Armored's historian and wrote 11 articles for the association's newsletter for over a decade; 12 these articles became three books: Hellcat Historian, Hellcat 13 Historian II, and Hellcat Heroes; he was involved in the 14 American Ex-Prisoner of War Association (Fox Valley Chapter) 15 and often gave talks to local grade schools about World War II; 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, Edward Waszak was preceded in death by his 18 parents; his sister, Ann Mazzocco (Leonard); and his brother, 19 Richard (Ramona); and
- 20 WHEREAS, Edward Waszak is survived by his wife, Therese; 21 his daughter, Mary Ellen; his sons, Michael (Denise) and Daniel 22 (Kimberly); his grandchildren, Christian (Shannon), Brandon 23 (Kathryn), Alexandra, Adam, and Emily; and his sisters,

- 1 Jeanette Meier (Everett), Elaine Wolfe (Robert), and
- 2 Bernadette Massaro; therefore, be it
