Amend House Bill 2924 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic 4 5 Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding Sections 605-1030 and 605-1035 as follows: 6 7 (20 ILCS 605/605-1030 new) Sec. 605-1030. Office of Inclusion. 8 (a) The Office of Inclusion is hereby created within the 9 10 Department. The Office shall assist minority-owned businesses, 11 women-owned businesses, veteran-owned businesses and 12 businesses owned by persons with disabilities through targeted 13 programs, resources, and outreach and promotional activities. The Office shall engage in or conduct the following activities: 14 15 (1) promoting and conducting outreach efforts with

- (2) providing and hosting workshops and public forums and engaging in outreach efforts for minority-owned businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned businesses and businesses owned by persons with disabilities to encourage participation in programs authorized by the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Women and Persons with Disabilities Act and the Illinois Procurement Code;
- (3) providing and hosting workshops and public forums and engaging in outreach efforts that assist and educate minority-owned businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned businesses and businesses owned by persons with disabilities on the process of applying for and becoming certified to apply for State grant funds under the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act; and
- (4) providing and hosting workshops and public forums and engaging in outreach efforts that assist and educate aspiring and existing minority-owned businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities in understanding concepts such as, but not limited to,

business formation, business planning, capital access marketing a business. (b) In order to facilitate and encourage the grow supplier diversity, the Office may have at least one em that serves as a supplier diversity program manager to collect reports and information concerning entities manage supplier diversity programs and (ii) conduct workshops focused on specific industries to collaborate connect diverse enterprises with entities that manage supplied diversity programs. 18	(6) the particular areas of spending in the next fiscal
19	year that the entity intends to procure that are most
20	relevant to minority-owned and women-owned businesses.
21	(d) In addition, the Office shall compile and publish or
22	its website a master database for all points of contract,
23	certifications accepted, and links to the most recent supplier
24	diversity reports submitted to the Department under:

12	(e) The Office shall administer programs established by the
13	Department, the General Assembly, or both and shall provide
14	grants to minority-owned business, woman-owned businesses,
15	veteran-owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
16	disabilities. The Office may establish applications,
17	notifications, contracts, and other forms or procedures and may
18	use vendors or contract work to carry out the purposes of this
19	Act. The Office may coordinate assistance for businesses with
20	other State agencies.
21	(f) The Department shall provide staff, administrative
22	support, and related support to the Office as required to
23	administer this Section and may adopt rules to administer this
24	Section.

1 Sec. 605-1035. Higher education supplier diversity report. 2 Every private institution of higher education approved by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission for the purposes of the 3 4 Monetary Award Program shall submit a 2-page report on its 5 voluntary supplier diversity program to the Department in the 6 form and manner required by the Department by April 1 of every 7 year. The Department shall hold an annual workshop open to the public with leaders of private institutions of higher education 8 9 and minority-owned and women-owned businesses in July of every 10 year.

11 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 12 becoming law.".
