## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

```
225 ILCS 605/3.8
```

Amends the Animal Welfare Act. Provides that a pet shop operator may offer for sale only those dogs or cats obtained from an animal control center, animal care facility, kennel, pound, or training facility operated by any subdivision of local, State, or federal government, or a humane society or rescue organization. Provides that no pet shop operator may offer for sale any dog or cat obtained from a breeder unless the breeder holds a valid USDA Class "A" license as defined in the Code of Federal Regulations implementing the federal Animal Welfare Act, listing all site addresses where regulated animals are located; the breeder owns or possesses no more than 5 female dogs or cats capable of reproduction in any 12-month period; and no more than 5 female dogs or cats capable of reproduction are housed at the site address where the retail animal was born or housed, including animals owned by persons other than the breeder. Effective January 1, 2020.

## A BILL FOR

AN ACT concerning regulation.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Animal Welfare Act is amended by changing Section 3.8 as follows:
(225 ILCS 605/3.8)
Sec. 3.8. Sourcing of dogs and cats sold by pet shops.
(a) A pet shop operator may offer for sale only those dogs or cats obtained from A pet shop operator may not obtain a dog or cat for resale or sell or offer for sale any dog or cat obtained from a person who is required to be lieensed by the pet dealex regulations of the United States Department of Agrieulture under the federal Animal Helfare Act (7 U.S.C. 2131 et seq.) if any of the following applies to the original predex:
(1) an animal control center, animal care facility, kennel, pound, or training facility operated by any subdivision of local, State, or federal government; or the person is not eurrently lieensed by the United States Department of Agriculture under the federal Animal Welfare Act.
(2) a humane society or rescue organization turing the z year period fore the day the dog or eat is reecived by

> the pet shop, the person received a direct or eritical non-compliant citation on a final inspection report from the United States Department of Agriculture under the federal Animal Welfare Act.
> (3) During the Z-year period before the day the dogox eat is receive by the pet shop, the person received 3 ox more non-compliant citationson a final inspection report from the United States Department of Agriculture for fiolations relating to the healthor welfare of the animal and the violations wre not administrative in nature. (4) The pexson received a no-acess violation on each of the 3 mest recent final inspection reports from the United States Department of Agrieulture.
(b) (Blank). A pet shop operator is presuld have acted in good faith and to have satisfied itsobligation to asecxtain whether a person meets the eriteria described in subsection (a) of this section if, when placing an oxdex to obtain a dog or eat for sale or resale, the pet shop operator eonducts a seareh for inspection reports that are readily available of the bredex on the Animal Care Information System online seaxeh tool maintained by the United States Department of Agriculture. If inspection reports are not readily available on the United States Department of Agriculture whsite, the pet shop-operator must obtain the inspection reports from the person or persons required to met the eriteria deseribed in subsection (a) of this Section.
(b-5) No pet shop operator may offer for sale any dog or cat obtained from a breeder unless the following requirements are met:
(A) the breeder holds a valid USDA Class "A" license as defined in 9 CFR 1.1, listing all site addresses where regulated animals are located;
(B) the breeder owns or possesses no more than 5 female dogs or cats capable of reproduction in any 12-month period; and
(C) no more than 5 female dogs or cats capable of reproduction are housed at the site address where the retail animal was born or housed, including animals owned by persons other than the breeder.
(c) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b-5) of this Section, a pet shop operator may obtain a dog or cat for resale or sell or offer for sale any dog or cat obtained from: (1) a person that sells dogs only he or she has produced and raised and who is not required to be licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture, (2) a publicly operated pound or a private non-profit humane society or rescue, or (3) an animal adoption event conducted by a pound or humane society.
(d) A pet shop operator shall maintain records verifying its compliance with this Section for 2 years after obtaining the dog or cat to be sold or offered for sale. Records maintained pursuant to this subsection (d) shall be open to inspection on request by a Department of Agriculture inspector.
