SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/48-4.5 new

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person commits misrepresentation of a service animal when he or she knowingly represents, expressly or impliedly, that the animal is a service animal for the purpose of securing the rights and privileges afforded to a person with a disability accompanied by a service animal and the person knew or should have known that the animal is not a service animal. Provides that the refusal to answer questions from a law enforcement officer permitted under federal regulation creates a permissive inference that the animal is not a service animal and the law enforcement officer may require the person to remove the animal from the place of public accommodation. Provides that misrepresentation of a service animal is a petty offense. Defines "service animal".

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by adding
 Section 48-4.5 as follows:

- 7 <u>Sec. 48-4.5. Misrepresentation of a service animal.</u>

(a) In this Section, "service animal" means a dog or 8 9 miniature horse that is trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of a person with a disability, including a 10 physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental 11 12 disability. The work or tasks performed by the animal must be directly related to the person's disability including, but not 13 14 limited to, assisting a person who is visually impaired with navigation and other tasks, alerting a person who is deaf or 15 16 hard of hearing to the presence of people or sounds, providing nonviolent protection or rescue work, pulling a wheelchair, 17 assisting a person during a seizure, alerting a person to the 18 19 presence of allergens, retrieving items such as medicine or the 20 telephone, providing physical support and assistance with 21 balance and stability to a person with mobility disabilities, 22 or helping a person with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting impulsive or 23

<u>disruptive behaviors. Work or tasks do not include the animal's</u>
 <u>presence as a deterrent for criminal activity, emotional</u>
 support, well-being, comfort, or companionship.

(b) A person commits misrepresentation of a service animal when he or she knowingly represents, expressly or impliedly, that the animal is a service animal for the purpose of securing the rights and privileges afforded to a person with a disability accompanied by a service animal and the person knew or should have known that the animal is not a service animal.

10 <u>(c) The refusal to answer questions from a law enforcement</u> 11 <u>officer permitted under subsection (f) of 28 CFR 35.136 creates</u> 12 <u>a permissive inference that the animal is not a service animal</u> 13 <u>and the law enforcement officer may require the person to</u> 14 <u>remove the animal from the place of public accommodation.</u>

15 (d) Sentence. Misrepresentation of a service animal is a
 16 petty offense.
