SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 840/5

5 ILCS 840/10

Amends the First Responders Suicide Prevention Act. Provides that peer support advisors shall also receive appropriate training in identifying the symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder and to respond appropriately to individuals exhibiting those symptoms. Provides that "post-traumatic stress disorder" has the meaning defined by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board in its implementation of its training in post-traumatic stress disorder under the Illinois Police Training Act.

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1 AN ACT concerning government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The First Responders Suicide Prevention Act is
amended by changing Sections 5 and 10 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 840/5)

7 Sec. 5. Definitions. In this Act:

8 "Emergency services provider" means any public employer 9 that employs persons to provide firefighting services.

10 "Emergency services personnel" means any employee of an 11 emergency services provider who is engaged in providing 12 firefighting services.

any county sheriff, 13 "Law enforcement agency" means 14 municipal police department, police department established by a university, the Department of State Police, the Department of 15 Corrections, the Department of Children and Family Services, 16 the Division of Probation Services of the Supreme Court, the 17 Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator, and other local or 18 19 county agency comprised of county probation officers, 20 corrections employees, or 9-1-1 telecommunicators or emergency 21 medical dispatchers.

22 "Peer support advisor" means an employee, approved by the 23 law enforcement agency or the emergency provider, who - 2 - LRB101 18254 RLC 67698 b

voluntarily provides confidential support and assistance to fellow employees experiencing personal or professional problems, including post-traumatic stress disorder. An emergency services provider or law enforcement agency shall provide peer support advisors with an appropriate level of training in counseling to provide emotional and moral support.

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7 "Peer support counseling program" means a program 8 established by an emergency services provider, a law 9 enforcement agency, or collective bargaining organization to 10 train employees to serve as peer support advisors to conduct 11 peer support counseling sessions.

12 "Peer support counseling session" means communication with 13 a peer support advisor designated by an emergency services 14 provider or law enforcement agency. A peer support counseling 15 session is accomplished primarily through listening, 16 assessing, assisting with problem-solving, making referrals to 17 a professional when necessary and conducting follow-up as 18 needed.

23 "Public safety personnel" means any employee of a law 24 enforcement agency.

Establishment of Sec. peer support program; 3 applicability. emergency services provider, Any law 4 enforcement agency, or collective bargaining organization that 5 creates a peer support program is subject to this Act. An 6 emergency services provider, law enforcement agency, or 7 collective bargaining organization shall ensure that peer 8 support advisors receive appropriate training in counseling to 9 conduct peer support counseling sessions. Pee<u>r support</u> 10 advisors shall also receive appropriate training in 11 identifying the symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder and 12 to respond appropriately to individuals exhibiting those 13 symptoms. Emergency services personnel and public safety 14 personnel may refer any person to a peer support advisor within 15 the emergency services provider or law enforcement agency, or 16 if those services are not available within the agency, to 17 another peer support counseling program that is available and approved by the emergency services provider or law enforcement 18 agency. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, public 19 20 safety personnel may not mandate that any employee participate 21 in a peer support counseling program.
