### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Appropriates \$21,635,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the State Board of Elections for operational expenses, grants, and reimbursements. Appropriates \$4,986,500 to the State Board of Elections from the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund for its ordinary and contingent expenses. Reappropriates \$28,561,900 from the Help Illinois Vote Fund to the State Board of Elections for implementation of the Help America Vote Act of 2002. Effective July 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. In addition to other sums appropriated, the sum  
5 of \$21,635,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is  
6 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the State Board  
7 of Elections for operational expenses, grants, reimbursements  
8 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021.

9 Section 10. The following amounts, or so much of those  
10 amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated  
11 from the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund to the State  
12 Board of Elections for its ordinary and contingent expenses as  
13 follows:

- 14 For reimbursement to counties for increased compensation
- 15 judges and other election officials, as provided in
- 16 Public Acts 81-850, 81-1149, and 90-672 - Election
- 17 Day Judges only .....4,200,000
- 18 For payment of lump sum awards to county clerks,
- 19 County recorders, and chief election clerks as
- 20 compensation for additional duties required of
- 21 such officials by consolidation of elections law,
- 22 as provided in Public Acts 82-691 and 90-713 .....786,500

2 Section 15. The following amounts, or so much thereof as  
3 may be necessary, are reappropriated from the Help Illinois  
4 Vote Fund to the State Board of Elections for implementation  
5 of the Help America Vote Act of 2002:

6 For the implementation of the Statewide Voter  
7 Registration System, as required by Section  
8 1A-25 of the Election Code, including  
9 maintenance of the IDEA/VISTA program .....1,223,100

10 For administrative costs and discretionary grants  
11 to local election authorities under Section 101  
12 of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 .....206,500

13 For administrative costs and discretionary grants  
14 to local election authorities under the 2018  
15 and 2020 HAVA Election Security Grant .....27,132,300

16 Total \$28,561,900

17 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
