**SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:**

ILCON Art. V, Sec. 2

Proposes to amend the Executive Article of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that a person may not be elected to any single Executive Branch office for more than two terms in each office; service before the second Monday in January of 2023 shall not be considered in the calculation of a person's service. Effective upon being declared adopted.

3 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE  
4 HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE  
5 SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the  
6 electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general  
7 election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of  
8 this resolution a proposition to amend Section 2 of Article V  
9 of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

10 ARTICLE V  
11 THE EXECUTIVE

12 (ILCON Art. V, Sec. 2)

13 SECTION 2. TERMS

14 These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold  
15 office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January  
16 after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant  
17 Governor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be  
18 elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years  
19 thereafter. A person may not be elected to any single Executive  
20 Branch office for more than two terms in each office. Service  
21 before the second Monday in January of 2023 shall not be  
22 considered in the calculation of a person's service.
