HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, In late summer and the fall of 2017, sexual 3 harassment claims nationwide began to come to light with a 4 rapid pace; and

5 WHEREAS, The concerns regarding sexual harassment in 6 Illinois politics came to the forefront following a letter 7 signed by over 150 men and women that detailed sexual 8 harassment over the years; and

9 WHEREAS, Legislation began moving through the Illinois 10 Legislature that prohibited sexual harassment, increased 11 requirements in personnel policies, required mandatory 12 training, and required local governments to have sexual 13 harassment policies; and

14 WHEREAS, This culture is not limited to state government; 15 Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle learned in March 16 of 2018 that her chief of staff had been behaving 17 inappropriately towards women; and

18 WHEREAS, Toni Preckwinkle took no action until September of 19 2018 when she fired her chief of staff, alleging that she 20 learned of the allegations only a few days before; and HR0033 -2- LRB101 05133 MST 50145 r
1 WHEREAS, Toni Preckwinkle has stated that she has made the
2 prohibition of harassment, including the prohibition of sexual
3 harassment, a priority; and

WHEREAS, The egregious six month delay in action by Toni Preckwinkle is contrary to her statement that the prohibition of sexual harassment is a priority; therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE 8 HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that 9 we urge the Cook County Board to investigate Cook County Board 10 President Toni Preckwinkle's six month delay in firing her 11 chief of staff for inappropriate behavior; and be it further

12 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be 13 delivered to the Cook County Board.
