creative skills to make a quilt for each of her ten grandchildren and crochet afghans and dishcloths; when she is not reading, she plays cards or Yahtzee, listens to Frank Sinatra, and spends time with family; she lives independently and spends afternoons on the front porch, as family and friends visit daily for coffee, cards, and conversation; therefore, be it
