2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 457 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by changing Section 9 as follows:
6	(110 ILCS 305/9) (from Ch. 144, par. 30)
7	Sec. 9. Scholarships for children of veterans. For each of
8	the following periods of hostilities, each county shall be
9	entitled, annually, to one honorary scholarship in the
10	University, for the benefit of the children of persons who
11	served in the armed forces of the United States, except that
12	the total number of scholarships annually granted to recipients
13	from each county may not exceed 3: any time between September
14	16, 1940 and the termination of World War II, any time during
15	the national emergency between June 25, 1950 and January 31,
16	1955, any time during the Viet Nam conflict between January 1,

1 1961 and May 7, 1975, any time during the siege of Beirut and 2 the Grenada Conflict between June 14, 1982 and December 15, 1983, or any time on or after August 2, 1990 and until Congress 3 4 or the President orders that persons in service are no longer 5 eligible for the Southwest Asia Service Medal, Operation 6 Enduring Freedom, and Operation Iraqi Freedom. Preference for scholarships shall be given to the children of persons who are 7 deceased or to the children of persons who have a disability, 8 9 including the children of veterans who were police officers or 10 fire officers and were killed in the line of duty while 11 employed by, or in the voluntary service of, this State or any local public entity in this State. Such scholarships shall be 12 13 granted to such pupils as shall, upon public examination, conducted as the board of trustees of the University may 14 15 determine, be decided to have attained the greatest proficiency 16 in the branches of learning usually taught in the secondary schools, and who shall be of good moral character, and not less 17 than 15 years of age. Such pupils, so selected, shall be 18 entitled to receive, without charge for tuition, instruction in 19 20 any or all departments of the University for a term of at least 4 consecutive years. Such pupils shall conform, in all 21 22 respects, to the rules and regulations of the University, 23 established for the government of the pupils in attendance.
