

101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 SB1258

Introduced 2/6/2019, by Sen. Bill Cunningham

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

210 ILCS 50/3.233 new 30 ILCS 805/8.43 new

Amends the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act. Provides that covered vehicle service provider personnel who treat and either release or transport to a health care facility an individual experiencing a suspected or an actual opioid overdose shall document in the patient's care report the date and time of the overdose, the location in latitude and longitude where the overdose victim was initially encountered, whether one or more doses of an opioid overdose reversal drug was administered, and whether the overdose was fatal or nonfatal when the overdose victim was initially encountered and during the transportation of the victim to a health care facility. Provides that a covered vehicle service provider shall also provide the information to a specified mapping application. Provides that the information documented by a covered vehicle service provider shall not be used in an opioid use-related criminal investigation or prosecution of the individual treated by the covered vehicle service provider personnel. Exempts from civil or criminal liability all covered vehicle service providers and covered vehicle service provider personnel who report the information in good faith. Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement by the State. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

STATE MANDATES ACT MAY REQUIRE REIMBURSEMENT 1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act is amended by adding Section 3.233 as follows:
- 7 Sec. 3.233. Opioid overdose reporting.

(210 ILCS 50/3.233 new)

- 8 (a) In this Section:
- 9 <u>"Covered vehicle service provider" means a licensed</u>
 10 <u>vehicle service provider that is a municipality with a</u>
- population of 1,000,000 or greater.
- 12 <u>"Covered vehicle service provider personnel" means</u>
- individuals licensed by the Department as an EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT,
- 14 <u>or EMT-P who are employed by a covered vehicle service</u>
- 15 <u>provider.</u>

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- "Opioid" means any narcotic containing opium or one or more of its natural or synthetic derivatives.
- "Overdose" means a physiological event that results in a

 life-threatening emergency to an individual who ingested,
- inhaled, injected, or otherwise bodily absorbed an opioid.
- 21 (b) Covered vehicle service provider personnel who treat

4	(c) A patient care report of an overdose made under this

11	(3) whether one or more doses of an opioid overdose
12	reversal drug was administered; and
13	(4) whether the overdose was fatal or nonfatal when the
14	overdose victim was initially encountered by the covered
15	vehicle service provider personnel and during the
16	transportation of the victim to a health care facility.
17	(d) Upon receipt of a patient care report that documents an
18	overdose, a covered vehicle service provider shall report the
19	information listed under subsection (c) to:
20	(i) the Washington/Baltimore High Intensity Drug
21	Trafficking Area Overdose Detection Mapping Application;
22	<u>or</u>
23	(ii) any similar information technology platform with
24	secure access operated by the federal government or a unit
25	of state or local government, as determined by the covered
26	vehicle service provider.

- 1 (e) Overdose information reported by a covered vehicle
 2 service provider under this Section shall not be used in an
 3 opioid use-related criminal investigation or prosecution of
 4 the individual who was treated by the covered vehicle service
 5 provider personnel for experiencing the suspected or actual
- 6 overdose.

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- (f) Covered vehicle service providers or covered vehicle

- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
