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(e) Overdose information reported by a covered vehicle 1 2 service provider under this Section shall not be used in an 3 opioid use-related criminal investigation or prosecution of 4 the individual who was treated by the covered vehicle service provider personnel for experiencing the suspected or actual 5 6 overdose. (f) Covered vehicle service providers or covered vehicle 7 service provider personnel that in good faith make a report 8 9 under this Section shall be immune from civil or criminal 10 liability for making the report.

Section 90. The State Mandates Act is amended by adding Section 8.43 as follows:

Sec. 8.43. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6 and 8 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required for the implementation of any mandate created by this amendatory Act of the 101st General Assembly.
