15	society, leading to calamitous conse	quences. To reinforce that
16	lesson, such curriculum shall inclu	ude an additional unit of

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1 instruction studying other genocides acts of genocide across the globe. This unit must shall include, without limitation but 2 not be limited to, Native Americans in the United States of 3 4 America, the Armenian Genocide, the Famine-Genocide in 5 Ukraine, and more recent genocides atrocities in Cambodia 6 committed by the Khmer Rouge, Bosnia, Rwanda, and Sudan, and Myanmar against the Rohingya Muslims. The studying of this 7 material is a reaffirmation of the commitment of free peoples 8 9 from all nations to never again permit the occurrence of 10 another Holocaust or genocide and a recognition that genocides 11 crimes of genocide continue to be perpetrated across the globe as they have been in the past and to deter indifference to 12 13 crimes against humanity and human suffering wherever they may 14 occur.

The State Superintendent of Education may prepare and make available to all school boards instructional materials which may be used as guidelines for development of a unit of instruction under this Section; provided, however, that each school board shall itself determine the minimum amount of instruction time which shall qualify as a unit of instruction satisfying the requirements of this Section.

25 (a) Every public elementary school and high school shall

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1 include in its curriculum a unit of instruction studying the events of Asian American history, including the history of 2 Asian Americans in Illinois and the Midwest, as well as the 3 4 contributions of Asian Americans toward advancing civil rights 5 from the 19th century onward. These events shall include the 6 contributions made by individual Asian Americans in government and the arts, humanities, and sciences, as well as the 7 contributions of Asian American communities to the economic, 8 9 cultural, social, and political development of the United 10 States. The studying of this material shall constitute an affirmation by students of their commitment to respect the 11 dignity of all races and peoples and to forever eschew every 12 13 form of discrimination in their lives and careers.

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14 (b) The State Superintendent of Education may prepare and 15 make available to all school boards instructional materials, including those established by the Public Broadcasting 16 Service, that may be used as guidelines for development of a 17 unit of instruction under this Section. However, each school 18 19 board shall itself determine the minimum amount of 20 instructional time that shall qualify as a unit of instruction 21 satisfying the requirements of this Section.

(c) The regional superintendent of schools shall monitor a
 school district's compliance with this Section's curricular
 requirements during his or her annual compliance visit.

History of the United 20 21 States shall be taught in all public schools and in all other 22 educational institutions in this State supported or 23 maintained, in whole or in part, by public funds. In public schools only, 26 the teaching of history shall include a study of the roles and

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1 contributions of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people in the history of this country and this State. The 2 3 teaching of history also shall include a study of the role of 4 labor unions and their interaction with government in achieving 5 the goals of a mixed free enterprise system. Beginning with the 6 2020-2021 school year, the teaching of history must also include instruction on the history of Illinois. No pupils shall 7 be graduated from the eighth grade of any public school unless 8 9 he or she has received such instruction in the history of the 10 United States and gives evidence of having a comprehensive 11 knowledge thereof.

14 Section 95. No acceleration or delay. Where this Act makes 15 changes in a statute that is represented in this Act by text 16 that is not yet or no longer in effect (for example, a Section 17 represented by multiple versions), the use of that text does 18 not accelerate or delay the taking effect of (i) the changes 19 made by this Act or (ii) provisions derived from any other 20 Public Act.

21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 22 2021.".
