1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1852

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend Senate Bill 1852 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Environmental Protection Act is amended by  
5 adding Section 9.16 as follows:

6 (415 ILCS 5/9.16 new)

7 Sec. 9.16. Notice for facilities emitting ethylene oxide.

8 (a) Any facility that self-reports an ethylene oxide leak  
9 or is found to be in violation concerning an ethylene oxide  
10 leak shall issue a notice immediately upon discovery of the  
11 leak to all affected property owners and units of local  
12 government within 2,500 feet of the leak site. The notice  
13 system shall be funded by the facility. The notice shall, at a  
14 minimum, contain the following information:

15 (1) the name and address of the site or facility where  
16 the leak occurred or is suspected to have occurred;

1           (2) the identification and approximate amount of the  
2           contaminant leaked or suspected to have been leaked;

3           (3) information as to whether the contaminant was  
4           leaked or suspected to have been leaked into the air, land,  
5           or water;

6           (4) a brief description of the potential adverse health  
7           effects posed by the contaminant;

8           (5) the name, business address, and phone number of  
9           persons at the Agency from whom additional information  
10           about the leak or suspected leak can be obtained;

11           (6) the name, business address, and phone number of  
12           persons at the Department of Public Health from whom  
13           additional information about the health effects of the leak  
14           or suspected leak can be obtained;

15           (7) the date, time of occurrence, and duration of the  
16           leak; and

17           (8) if known, the wind direction during the leak.

18           (b) The provisions of this Section apply only to an owner  
19           or operator of a sterilization source using one ton or more of  
20           ethylene oxide in a rolling 12-month period of sterilization or  
21           fumigation operations. This Section does not apply to: beehive  
22           fumigators; research or laboratory facilities, as defined in  
23           Section 112(c) (7) of Title III of the federal Clean Air Act; or  
24           sources such as hospitals, doctors' offices, clinics, or other  
25           facilities for which the primary purpose is to provide medical  
26           services to humans or animals."
