A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and
6 reappropriations for State fiscal year 2020. Article 6, Article
7 19 and Article 36 contain reappropriations of certain
8 appropriations as may have been appropriated for State fiscal
9 year 2019 by Article 138, Section 125, Article 147, Section 176
10 and Article 162, Section 125 and Article 162, Section 105, of
11 Public Act 100-0586, as amended. To the extent that Article
12 138, Section 125, Article 147, Section 176 and Article 162,
13 Section 125 and Article 162, Section 105, of Public Act 100-
14 0586 have not been enacted as amended, Article 7, Article 20
15 and Article 37 contain appropriations of identical amounts and
16 purposes to those in Article 6, Article 19 and Article 36 but
17 as new appropriations rather than as reappropriations. Section
18 999 of Article 999 sets forth an effective date that causes
19 Article 6, Article 19 and Article 36 to become effective if,
20 and only if, Article 138, Section 125, Article 147, Section 176
21 and Article 162, Section 125 and Article 162, Section 105 of
22 Public Act 100-0586, should be amended; should such an
23 amendment not be enacted, the Section causes Article 7, Article

1 20 and Article 37 to become effective.

2 ARTICLE 2

3 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
4 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
5 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
6 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
7 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
8 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
9 and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed
10 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by
11 the State.

12 ARTICLE 3

13 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

14 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
16 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
17 such purpose in Article 138, Section 5 of Public Act 100-0586,
18 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a grant
20 to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
21 improvements, including prior incurred costs.

22 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
2 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
3 such purpose in Article 138, Section 10 of Public Act 100-0586,
4 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
5 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
7 including prior incurred costs.

8 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
11 such purpose in Article 138, Section 15 of Public Act 100-0586,
12 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
15 including prior incurred costs.

16 Section 20. The sum of \$1,052,757, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
18 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
19 such purpose in Article 138, Section 20 of Public Act 100-0586,
20 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
21 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
22 grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for capital
23 improvements, acquisition and development of land and

1 structures, including prior incurred costs.

2 Section 25. The sum of \$12,386,633, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
4 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
5 such purpose in Article 138, Section 25 of Public Act 100-0586,
6 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
8 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park, including
9 prior incurred costs.

10 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 138, Section 30 of Public Act 100-0586,
14 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
17 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act, including prior
18 incurred costs.

19 Section 35. The sum of \$75,338,451, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 138, Section 35 of Public Act 100-0586,

1 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
2 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
3 purpose of making grants and loans to local governments for
4 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
5 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
6 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
7 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
8 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
9 prior incurred costs.

10 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 138, Section 40 of Public Act 100-0586,
14 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
16 grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the
17 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
18 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois, and
19 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section
20 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
21 agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

22 Section 45. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose in Article 138, Section 45 of Public Act 100-0586,
3 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
6 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
7 purposes, including prior incurred costs.

8 Section 50. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
11 such purpose in Article 138, Section 50 of Public Act 100-0586,
12 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
15 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
16 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
17 such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

18 Section 55. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose in Article 138, Section 55 of Public Act 100-0586,
22 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
23 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
2 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
3 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
4 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
5 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
6 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
7 prior incurred costs.

8 Section 60. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
11 such purpose in Article 138, Section 60 of Public Act 100-0586,
12 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
15 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
16 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
17 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
18 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
19 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
20 prior incurred costs.

21 Section 65. The sum of \$1,195,268, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
23 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose in Article 138, Section 65 of Public Act 100-0586,
2 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
3 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
4 grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts,
5 including prior incurred costs.

6 Section 70. The sum of \$398,974,111, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
9 such purpose in Article 138, Section 70 of Public Act 100-0586,
10 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
11 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 grants awarded under the Urban Weatherization Initiative Act,
13 including prior incurred costs.

14 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
16 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
17 such purpose in Article 138, Section 75 of Public Act 100-0586,
18 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
21 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
22 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
23 distance learning, and public safety, including prior incurred

1 costs.

2 Section 80. The sum of \$15,080,745, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
4 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
5 such purpose in Article 138, Section 80 of Public Act 100-0586,
6 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
9 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
10 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
11 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
12 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
13 machinery and equipment, including prior incurred costs.

14 Section 85. The sum of \$2,330,884, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
16 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
17 such purpose in Article 138, Section 85 of Public Act 100-0586,
18 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
20 requirements necessary to leverage capital-related American
21 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds of equal or greater
22 value in order to make Illinois or Illinois applicants more
23 competitive and/or for costs associated with bondable

1 improvements to match federal, local, private or other funds,
2 including prior incurred costs.

3 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
4 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
5 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
6 such purpose in Article 138, Section 90 of Public Act 100-0586,
7 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
8 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
9 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
10 hospital renovation and equipment, including prior incurred
11 costs.

12 Section 95. The sum of \$2,978,788, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 138, Section 95 of Public Act 100-0586,
16 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
19 including prior incurred costs.

20 Section 100. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
22 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose in Article 138, Section 105 of Public Act 100-
 2 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
 3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 4 Opportunity for grants for acquisition, construction,
 5 renovation and equipping new charter schools, to a silver
 6 certification from the United States Green Building Council's
 7 Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Green Building
 8 Rating System as approximated below:

9 For Instituto Del Progreso Latino9,000,000,
 10 Including prior incurred costs.

11 Section 105. The sum of \$2,606,686, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
 13 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
 14 such purpose in Article 138, Section 110 of Public Act 100-
 15 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
 16 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 17 Opportunity to provide grants, loans, and other investments to
 18 emerging technology enterprises to support and encourage: (i)
 19 commercialization of technology based products and services;
 20 (ii) technology transfer projects involving the promotion of
 21 new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research and
 22 development projects to respond to unique, advanced technology
 23 projects and which foster the development of Illinois' economy
 24 through the advancement of the State's economic, scientific,

1 and technological assets, including prior incurred costs.

2 Section 110. The sum of \$5,938,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
4 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
5 such purpose in Article 138, Section 115 of Public Act 100-
6 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity to provide grants for land acquisition,
9 infrastructure, equipment and other permissible capital
10 expenditures to businesses that will encourage new investment
11 and the creation or retention of jobs in economically depressed
12 areas of the State, including prior incurred costs.

13 Section 115. The sum of \$3,301,210, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
15 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
16 such purpose in Article 138, Section 120 of Public Act 100-
17 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
18 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for a grant to the University of Chicago Medical
20 Center for costs associated with Provident Hospital, including
21 prior incurred costs.

22 Section 120. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
2 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
3 such purpose in Article 138, Section 130 of Public Act 100-
4 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
5 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
6 Opportunity for a grant to the Cook County Health and Hospital
7 System for costs associated with medical equipment and capital
8 improvements at Provident Hospital, including prior incurred
9 costs.

10 Section 125. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 138, Section 140 of Public Act 100-
14 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for grants awarded in conjunction with the Office
17 of Minority Economic Empowerment, including prior incurred
18 costs.

19 Section 130. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 138, Section 145 of Public Act 100-
23 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for costs associated with the Cairo Port
3 Development, including prior incurred costs.

4 Section 135. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
6 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
7 such purpose in Article 138, Section 165 of Public Act 100-
8 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
9 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for a grant to Erie Neighborhood House, including
11 prior incurred costs.

12 Section 140. The sum of \$338,579, or so much thereof as may
13 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 138, Section 170 of Public Act 100-
16 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
17 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for a grant to Family Guidance Center, including
19 prior incurred costs.

20 Section 145. The sum of \$14,715,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
22 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose in Article 162, Section 135 of Public Act 100-
2 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for a grant to Greater Rockford Airport Authority
5 to support the construction of a Maintenance, Repair and
6 Overhaul (MRO) facility, including prior incurred costs.

7 Section 150. The sum of \$500,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
10 such purpose in Article 138, Section 150 of Public Act 100-
11 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for the development of the University of Illinois
14 Discovery Partner's Institute, including prior incurred costs.

15 Section 155. No contract shall be entered into or
16 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
17 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
18 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
19 Governor.

1 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

2 Section 5. The sum of \$8,755,676, or so much thereof as may be
3 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on
4 June 30, 2019, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such
5 purpose in Article 139, Section 1 of Public Act 100-0586, as
6 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 grants to local governments for capital improvements to civic
9 centers, including prior incurred costs.

10 Section 10. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may
11 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2019, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 139, Section 5 of Public Act 100-0586,
14 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
16 grant to the Rockford District 205 for the project hereinafter
17 enumerated: CICS ROCKFORD CHARTER PATRIOTS CENTER, including
18 prior incurred costs.

19 Section 15. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2019, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 139, Section 10 of Public Act 100-0586,
23 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
2 grant to the Commuter Rail Division of the Regional
3 Transportation Authority for a Metra station at Peterson Avenue
4 and Ravenswood Avenue, including prior incurred costs.

5 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
6 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
7 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
8 been approved in writing by the Governor.

9 Total, this Article \$24,255,676

11 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

12 Section 5. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be
13 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on
14 June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for such
15 purpose in Article 137, Section 1 of Public Act 100-0586, as
16 amended, is reappropriated from the Port Development Revolving
17 Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the Port
19 Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-
20 11.

21 ARTICLE 6

1 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

2 Section 5. The sum of \$2,084,459, or so much thereof as may
3 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
4 on June 30, 2019, from an appropriation heretofore made for
5 such purpose in Article 138, Section 125 of Public Act 100-
6 0586, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
7 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for a grant to Community Health and Emergency
9 Services, Inc. for the construction of a hospital wing at the
10 Cairo Megaclinic, including prior incurred costs.

11 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
12 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
13 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
14 been approved in writing by the Governor.

15 ARTICLE 7

16 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

17 Section 5. The sum of \$2,084,459, is appropriated from the
18 Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and
19 Economic Opportunity for a grant to Community Health and
20 Emergency Services, Inc. for the construction of a hospital
21 wing at the Cairo Megaclinic, including prior incurred costs.

22 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or obligation

1 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
2 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
3 been approved in writing by the Governor.

4 ARTICLE 8

5 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

6 Section 5. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
8 to the Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
9 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the Agency's
10 operational expenses.

11 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as may
12 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
13 to the Department of Natural Resources for the administration
14 and payment of grants to local governmental units for the
15 construction, maintenance, and improvement of boat access
16 areas.

17 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as may
18 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
19 to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the
20 Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
21 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
22 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,

1 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
2 areas.

3 Section 20. To the extent federal funds, including
4 reimbursements, are available for such purposes, the sum of
5 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated
6 from the State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural
7 Resources for all costs for construction and development of
8 facilities for transient, non-trailerable recreational boats,
9 including grants for such purposes authorized under the Boating
10 Infrastructure Grant Program.

11 Section 25. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
13 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for multiple use
14 facilities and programs for boating purposes provided by the
15 Department of Natural Resources, including construction and
16 development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land
17 acquisition, services, studies and all other expenses required
18 to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

19 Section 30. The sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Parks Fund to the
21 Department of Natural Resources for matching recreational
22 trails and trail-related projects authorized under the

1 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991,
2 multiple use facilities and programs for park and trail
3 purposes provided by the Department of Natural Resources,
4 including construction and development, all costs for supplies,
5 materials, labor, land acquisition, services, studies, and all
6 other expenses required to comply with the intent of this
7 appropriation.

8 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund

2 1, 2019 if, and only if, an amendment to Article 138, Section
3 125, Article 147, Section 176 and Article 162, Section 125 and
4 Article 162, Section 105 of Public Act 100-0586 becomes law.
