

## 101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 SB2302

Introduced 11/12/2019, by Sen. Dale A. Righter

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 420/1-109 from Ch. 127, par. 601-109 5 ILCS 420/2-101 from Ch. 127, par. 602-101

Amends the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. Expands the definition of "lobbying" for purposes of the Act. Provides that no member of the General Assembly, his or her spouse, or any immediate family member living with that member of the General Assembly (currently, no legislator) may engage in lobbying if he or she accepts compensation specifically attributable to such lobbying, other than that provided by law for members of the General Assembly. Provides that nothing prohibits a member of the General Assembly (currently, legislator), his or her spouse, or any immediate family member living with that member of the General Assembly from lobbying without compensation. Provides that a violation of provisions prohibiting member lobbying constitutes a Class 3 felony (currently, Class A misdemeanor). Makes conforming changes. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Governmental Ethics Act is amended by changing Sections 1-109 and 2-101 as follows:
- 6 (5 ILCS 420/1-109) (from Ch. 127, par. 601-109)
- 7 Sec. 1-109. "Lobbying" means: (1) promoting or opposing in any manner the passage by the General Assembly of any 8 9 legislative matter affecting the interests of any individual, association or corporation as distinct from those of the people 10 of the State as a whole; (2) any communication with an official 11 12 of the executive or legislative branch of State government, as defined under subsection (c) of Section 2 of the Lobbyist 13 14 Registration Act, for the ultimate purpose of influencing any executive, legislative, or administrative action; or (3) any 15 16 communication with an official of a unit of local government for the ultimate purpose of influencing any official action of 17

- 20 (5 ILCS 420/2-101) (from Ch. 127, par. 602-101)
- Sec. 2-101. No member of the General Assembly, his or her
- 22 spouse, or any immediate family member living with that member

- of the General Assembly <del>legislator</del> may engage in lobbying, as
- 2 that term is defined in Section 1-109, if he or she accepts
- 3 compensation specifically attributable to such lobbying, other
- 4 than that provided by law for members of the General Assembly.
- 5 Nothing in this Section prohibits a member of the General
- 6 Assembly, his or her spouse, or any immediate family member
- 7 <u>living with that member of the General Assembly <del>legislator</del> from</u>
- 8 lobbying without compensation.
- 9 A violation of this Section shall constitute a Class 3
- 10 <u>felony</u> A misdemeanor.
