SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 635/5.1

from Ch. 56 1/2, par. 2205.1

Amends the Grade A Pasteurized Milk and Milk Products Act. Removes language requiring the Department of Public Health to charge specific fees and instead directs the Department to determine an application fee for permits by rule. Provides that a permit issued by the Department is required prior to the operation of any milk plant, receiving station, transfer station, cleaning and sanitizing facility, milk hauler sampler, milk tank truck, or certified pasteurizer sealer. Requires the Department to determine and assess a late fee. Effective January 1, 2021.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Grade A Pasteurized Milk and Milk Products
5 Act is amended by changing Section 5.1 as follows:

7 Sec. 5.1. (a) (Blank). ~~The Department shall charge a fee of~~

20 (a-5) A permit issued by the Department is required prior
21 to the operation of any milk plant, receiving station, transfer
22 station, cleaning and sanitizing facility, milk hauler
23 sampler, milk tank truck, or certified pasteurizer sealer. The

1 operator of the facility shall file an application for a permit
2 with the Department that shall be accompanied by the requisite
3 fee, as determined by the Department by rule. In addition to
4 the fee, the Department shall determine and assess a late fee
5 if an application for renewal of a permit is received after the
6 expiration of an existing permit.

7 (b) All permit fees charged under this Section shall be
8 deposited into the Food and Drug Safety Fund.
