SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy Law. Requires a public school to provide to the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy, in a timely manner, all information necessary for the public school's students to apply to the Academy; sets forth certain types of information that must be provided.

STATE MANDATES ACT MAY REQUIRE REIMBURSEMENT 1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy Law is amended by changing Section 2 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 305/2) (from Ch. 122, par. 1503-2)

Sec. 2. Establishment, funding and location. There is hereby created the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy, 8 9 which shall be a residential institution located in the Fox River Valley in close proximity to the national science 10 laboratories based in Illinois. The Academy may develop 11 12 additional campuses throughout the State, however, additional campus does not need to serve as a residential 13 14 institution. The Academy shall be a State agency, funded by State appropriations, private contributions and endowments. 15 16 Minimal fees for residential students who are Illinois 17 residents may be charged. Tuition, fees, and room and board costs shall be charged for students who are not Illinois 18 19 residents, the totality of which must be sufficient to ensure 20 that no State appropriations are used to fund the costs of 21 those students attending the Academy. The Academy may admit students (i) who are Illinois residents or who are not Illinois 22 residents and (ii) who have completed the academic equivalent 2.3

In order to be eligible for State appropriations, the Academy shall submit to the Board of Higher Education not later than the 1st day of October of each year its budget proposal for the operation and capital needs of the Academy for its next fiscal year and information demonstrating that students who are not Illinois residents have paid and will pay tuition, fees,
