### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 705/15-40 410 ILCS 705/20-35 410 ILCS 705/25-35 410 ILCS 705/30-35 410 ILCS 705/35-30 410 ILCS 705/40-30

Amends the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act. Provides for the issuance of identification cards to specified qualifying agents within 5 (rather than 15) business days after approving the application or renewal application. Effective immediately.

- 1 AN ACT concerning health.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act is amended
by changing Sections 15-40, 20-35, 25-35, 30-35, 35-30, and
40-30 as follows:

7 (410 ILCS 705/15-40)

8 Sec. 15-40. Dispensing organization agent identification 9 card; agent training.

10 (a) The Department shall:

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(1) verify the information contained in an application 11 12 renewal for а dispensing organization agent or identification card submitted under this Article, and 13 14 approve or deny an application or renewal, within 30 days receiving completed application or 15 of а renewal 16 application and all supporting documentation required by 17 rule;

18 (2) issue a dispensing organization agent
 19 identification card to a qualifying agent within <u>5</u> <del>15</del>
 20 business days of approving the application or renewal;

(3) enter the registry identification number of the
 dispensing organization where the agent works;

(4) within one year from the effective date of this

Act, allow for an electronic application process and provide a confirmation by electronic or other methods that an application has been submitted; and

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(5) collect a \$100 nonrefundable fee from the applicant to be deposited into the Cannabis Regulation Fund.

6 (b) A dispensing organization agent must keep his or her 7 identification card visible at all times when in the 8 dispensary.

9 (c) The dispensing organization agent identification cards10 shall contain the following:

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(1) the name of the cardholder;

12 (2) the date of issuance and expiration date of the
 13 dispensing organization agent identification cards;

14 (3) a random 10-digit alphanumeric identification 15 number containing at least 4 numbers and at least 4 letters 16 that is unique to the cardholder; and

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(4) a photograph of the cardholder.

(d) The dispensing organization agent identification cards
shall be immediately returned to the dispensing organization
upon termination of employment.

(e) The Department shall not issue an agent identification
 card if the applicant is delinquent in filing any required tax
 returns or paying any amounts owed to the State of Illinois.

(f) Any card lost by a dispensing organization agent shall
be reported to the Department of State Police and the
Department immediately upon discovery of the loss.

1 (g) An applicant shall be denied a dispensing organization 2 agent identification card renewal if he or she fails to 3 complete the training provided for in this Section.

- 4 (h) A dispensing organization agent shall only be required
  5 to hold one card for the same employer regardless of what type
  6 of dispensing organization license the employer holds.
  - (i) Cannabis retail sales training requirements.

8 (1) Within 90 days of September 1, 2019, or 90 days of 9 employment, whichever is later, all owners, managers, 10 employees, and agents involved in the handling or sale of 11 cannabis or cannabis-infused product employed by an adult 12 use dispensing organization or medical cannabis dispensing 13 organization as defined in Section 10 of the Compassionate 14 Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act shall attend and 15 successfully complete a Responsible Vendor Program.

16 (2) Each owner, manager, employee, and agent of an
 17 adult use dispensing organization or medical cannabis
 18 dispensing organization shall successfully complete the
 19 program annually.

(3) Responsible Vendor Program Training modules shall
 include at least 2 hours of instruction time approved by
 the Department including:

(i) Health and safety concerns of cannabis use,
including the responsible use of cannabis, its
physical effects, onset of physiological effects,
recognizing signs of impairment, and appropriate

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responses in the event of overconsumption. 1 2 (ii) Training on laws and regulations on driving 3 while under the influence and operating a watercraft or snowmobile while under the influence. 4 (iii) Sales to minors prohibition. Training shall 5 cover all relevant Illinois laws and rules. 6 (iv) Quantity limitations on sales to purchasers. 7 Training shall cover all relevant Illinois laws and 8 9 rules. 10 (v) Acceptable forms of identification. Training 11 shall include: 12 (I) How to check identification; and 13 (II) Common mistakes made in verification; 14 (vi) Safe storage of cannabis; (vii) Compliance with all inventory tracking 15 16 system regulations; 17 (viii) Waste handling, management, and disposal; (ix) Health and safety standards; 18 (x) Maintenance of records; 19 20 (xi) Security and surveillance requirements; 21 (xii) Permitting inspections by State and local 22 licensing and enforcement authorities; 23 (xiii) Privacy issues; (xiv) Packaging and labeling requirement for sales 24 25 to purchasers; and 26 (xv) Other areas as determined by rule.

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(j) Blank.

2 (k) Upon the successful completion of the Responsible 3 Vendor Program, the provider shall deliver proof of completion 4 either through mail or electronic communication to the 5 dispensing organization, which shall retain a copy of the 6 certificate.

7 (1) The license of a dispensing organization or medical
8 cannabis dispensing organization whose owners, managers,
9 employees, or agents fail to comply with this Section may be
10 suspended or permanently revoked under Section 15-145 or may
11 face other disciplinary action.

(m) The regulation of dispensing organization and medical cannabis dispensing employer and employee training is an exclusive function of the State, and regulation by a unit of local government, including a home rule unit, is prohibited. This subsection (m) is a denial and limitation of home rule powers and functions under subsection (h) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution.

(n) Persons seeking Department approval to offer the training required by paragraph (3) of subsection (i) may apply for such approval between August 1 and August 15 of each odd-numbered year in a manner prescribed by the Department.

(o) Persons seeking Department approval to offer the
training required by paragraph (3) of subsection (i) shall
submit a nonrefundable application fee of \$2,000 to be
deposited into the Cannabis Regulation Fund or a fee as may be

set by rule. Any changes made to the training module shall be
 approved by the Department.

3 (p) The Department shall not unreasonably deny approval of 4 a training module that meets all the requirements of paragraph 5 (3) of subsection (i). A denial of approval shall include a 6 detailed description of the reasons for the denial.

7 (q) Any person approved to provide the training required by 8 paragraph (3) of subsection (i) shall submit an application for 9 re-approval between August 1 and August 15 of each odd-numbered 10 year and include a nonrefundable application fee of \$2,000 to 11 be deposited into the Cannabis Regulation Fund or a fee as may 12 be set by rule.

13 (r) All persons applying to become or renewing their 14 registrations to be agents, including agents-in-charge and principal officers, shall disclose any disciplinary action 15 16 taken against them that may have occurred in Illinois, another 17 state, or another country in relation to their employment at a cannabis business establishment or at any cannabis cultivation 18 19 center, processor, infuser, dispensary, or other cannabis 20 business establishment.

initial application or renewal application for an agent identification card submitted under this Act and the nonrefundable fee to accompany the initial application or renewal application;

5 (2) verify the information contained in an initial application or renewal 6 application for an agent 7 identification card submitted under this Act, and approve 8 or deny an application within 30 days of receiving a 9 completed initial application or renewal application and 10 all supporting documentation required by rule;

(3) issue an agent identification card to a qualifying
agent within <u>5</u> <del>15</del> business days of approving the initial
application or renewal application;

14 (4) enter the license number of the cultivation center15 where the agent works; and

(5) allow for an electronic initial application and
renewal application process, and provide a confirmation by
electronic or other methods that an application has been
submitted. The Department of Agriculture may by rule
require prospective agents to file their applications by
electronic means and provide notices to the agents by
electronic means.

(b) An agent must keep his or her identification card visible at all times when on the property of the cultivation center at which the agent is employed.

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(1) the name of the cardholder;

5 (3) a random 10-digit alphanumeric identification 6 number containing at least 4 numbers and at least 4 letters 7 that is unique to the holder;

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(4) a photograph of the cardholder; and

9 (5) the legal name of the cultivation center employing 10 the agent.

(d) An agent identification card shall be immediately returned to the cultivation center of the agent upon termination of his or her employment.

14 (e) Any agent identification card lost by a cultivation 15 center agent shall be reported to the Department of State 16 Police and the Department of Agriculture immediately upon 17 discovery of the loss.

(f) The Department of Agriculture shall not issue an agent identification card if the applicant is delinquent in filing any required tax returns or paying any amounts owed to the State of Illinois.

8 agent within <u>5</u> <del>15</del> business days of approving the initial
9 application or renewal application;

10 (4) enter the license number of the infuser where the 11 agent works; and

(5) allow for an electronic initial application and renewal application process, and provide a confirmation by electronic or other methods that an application has been submitted. (f) An application for an agent identification card shall be denied if the applicant is delinquent in filing any required tax returns or paying any amounts owed to the State of Illinois.
