## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 420/2-105 new

Amends the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. Provides that no person required to file a statement of economic interests under specified provisions, including employees of the Department of Transportation, shall, during the period of time for which he or she holds a position requiring disclosure of economic interests, hold any financial interest in or receive any compensation in the form of salary, wages, or commission from a provider of automated speed enforcement systems or automated traffic law enforcement systems. Provides that the provisions do not apply to candidates for office, and shall only apply if that candidate is elected to office. Requires the divestment of that financial interest. Defines terms. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Governmental Ethics Act is amended
by adding Section 2-105 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 420/2-105 new)

7 <u>Sec. 2-105. Red light camera financial interest</u>
8 <u>prohibition.</u>

9 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (a), no person required to file a statement of economic interests under 10 subsections (a) and (b) of Section 4A-101 or Section 4A-101.5, 11 12 or file as an employee of the Department of Transportation, shall, during the period of time for which he or she holds a 13 14 position requiring disclosure of economic interests, hold any financial interest in or receive any compensation in the form 15 16 of salary, wages, or commission from a provider of automated 17 speed enforcement systems or automated traffic law enforcement systems. The requirements of this subsection (a) do not apply 18 19 to candidates for office, and shall only apply if that 20 candidate is elected to office.

(b) Any person prohibited from holding a financial interest
 in or receiving compensation from a provider of automated speed
 enforcement systems or automated traffic law enforcement

11	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
