SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, On February 27, 1861, in an attempt to avert the secession of Southern states, United States Representative Thomas Corwin of Ohio proposed an amendment to the United States Constitution that would prohibit the United States Constitution from being amended in a manner that authorizes Congress to abolish or interfere with the states' domestic institutions, including slavery; and

- 9 WHEREAS, On March 2, 1861, the Corwin Amendment was
 10 approved by a joint resolution of the United States Congress
 11 (12 Stat. 251) and was submitted to the states for
 12 ratification; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Twenty-Third General Assembly ratified the 14 Corwin Amendment in "An Act ratifying a certain amendment to 15 the Constitution of the United States", in force June 2, 1863 16 (Public Laws 1863, p. 41); and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Corwin Amendment was not ratified by
 18 three-fourths of the states and, therefore, is not part of the
 19 United States Constitution; and
- 20 WHEREAS, With the end of the Civil War and the ratification 21 of the 13th Amendment to the United States Constitution, the

- 1 purposes of the Corwin Amendment have become moot; therefore,
- 2 be it
- 3 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL
- 4 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
- 5 CONCURRING HEREIN, That the State of Illinois rescinds its
- 6 ratification of the following proposition, known as the Corwin
- 7 Amendment to the United States Constitution:
- 8 "ARTICLE XIII.
- 9 No amendment shall be made to the Constitution which will
- 10 authorize or give to Congress the power to abolish or
- interfere, within any State, with the domestic institutions
- 12 thereof, including that of persons held to labor or service by
- the laws of said State."; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That a certified copy of this resolution be
- 15 forwarded to the Archivist of the United States, the President
- of the United States, the President pro tempore of the United
- 17 States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of
- 18 Representatives, and each member of the Illinois congressional
- 19 delegation.
