WHEREAS, Joe Fox was born in Danville to George William and Dorothy Hannaple Fox on July 10, 1936; he graduated from Danville High School, where he was captain of the golf and swimming teams; he attended General Motors Institute/Kettering University, where he received his bachelor's degree in industrial engineering; he was a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity; he earned his Master of Business Administration from Michigan State University, where he also served as the Director of Butterfield Residence Hall; he married Anne Maple in Peoria on June 29, 1963; and
