SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 66/60

Amends the Firearm Concealed Carry Act. Provides that the fees for a new and renewal concealed carry license of an applicant who is a veteran or a qualified retired law enforcement officer shall be 50% of the fees for other applicants. Defines "qualified retired law enforcement officer" and "veteran".

1 AN ACT concerning safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by 5 changing Section 60 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 66/60)

7 Sec. 60. Fees.

8 (a) All fees collected under this Act shall be deposited 9 as provided in this Section. Application, renewal, and 10 replacement fees shall be non-refundable.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b-5), an An applicant for a new license or a renewal shall submit \$150 with the application, of which \$120 shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$20 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

17 <u>(b-5) An applicant for a new license or a renewal who is a</u> 18 <u>veteran or a qualified retired law enforcement officer shall</u> 19 <u>submit \$75 with the application, of which \$60 shall be</u> 20 <u>apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$10</u> 21 <u>shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and</u> 22 <u>\$5 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.</u>

23 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c-5), a A

non-resident applicant for a new license or renewal shall submit \$300 with the application, of which \$250 shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$40 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

6 <u>(c-5) A non-resident applicant for a new license or a</u> 7 renewal who is a veteran or a qualified retired law 8 enforcement officer shall submit \$150 with the application, of 9 which \$125 shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm 10 Services Fund, \$20 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health 11 Reporting Fund, and \$5 shall be apportioned to the State Crime 12 Laboratory Fund.

(d) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (e), a A licensee requesting a new license in accordance with Section 55 shall submit \$75, of which \$60 shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$5 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

19 (e) A licensee who is a veteran or a qualified retired law 20 enforcement officer requesting a new license in accordance 21 with Section 55 shall submit \$37.50, of which \$30 shall be 22 apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$2.50 23 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and 24 \$5 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

26 <u>"Qualified retired law enforcement officer" means a</u>

1	qualified retired law enforcement officer as defined in the
2	federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 who is in
3	compliance with all of the requirements of that Act.
4	"Veteran" means a person who has served in the Armed
5	Forces of the United States and was discharged or separated
6	under honorable conditions.
