SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-20.73 new 105 ILCS 5/34-18.67 new

Amends the School Code. Requires school districts to provide contact information for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and for the Crisis Text Line on the back of each student identification card issued by the school district. Provides that if the school district does not issue student identification cards to its students or to all of its students, the school district must publish this information on its website. Effective July 1, 2021.

STATE MANDATES ACT MAY REQUIRE REIMBURSEMENT 1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections 10-20.73 and 34-18.67 as follows:

- 7 Sec. 10-20.73. Student identification; suicide prevention information. Each school district shall provide contact 8 9 information for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and for the Crisis Text Line on the back of each student 10 identification card issued by the school district. If the 11 12 school district does not issue student identification cards to its students or to all of its students, the school district 13 14 must publish this information on its website.

- Sec. 34-18.67. Student identification; suicide prevention
 information. The school district shall provide contact
 information for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and
 for the Crisis Text Line on the back of each student

 its students or to all of its students, the school district
