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AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities
Act is amended by changing Section 10 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 2405/10) (from Ch. 23, par. 3441)

7 Sec. 10. Residential schools; visual and hearing8 disabilities.

9 The Department of Human Services shall operate (a) residential schools for the education of children with visual 10 and hearing disabilities who are unable to take advantage of 11 the regular educational facilities provided in the community, 12 13 and shall provide in connection therewith such academic, 14 vocational, and related services as may be required. Children shall be eligible for admission to these schools only after 15 16 proper diagnosis and evaluation, in accordance with procedures 17 prescribed by the Department.

18 (a-5) The Superintendent of the Illinois School for the 19 Deaf shall be the chief executive officer of, and shall be 20 responsible for the day to day operations of, the School, and 21 shall obtain educational and professional employees who are 22 certified by the Illinois State Board of Education or licensed 23 by the appropriate agency or entity to which licensing HB1710 Enrolled - 2 - LRB102 12107 KTG 17444 b

authority has been delegated, as well as all other employees 1 2 of the School, subject to the provisions of the Personnel Code 3 and any applicable collective bargaining agreement. The Superintendent shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with 4 5 the advice and consent of the Senate. In the case of a vacancy in the office of Superintendent during the recess of the 6 7 Senate, the Governor shall make a temporary appointment until 8 the next meeting of the Senate, when the Governor shall 9 nominate some person to fill the office, and any person so 10 nominated who is confirmed by the Senate shall hold office 11 during the remainder of the term and until his or her successor 12 is appointed and qualified. The Superintendent shall hold office (i) for a term expiring on June 30 of 2015, and every 4 13 14 years thereafter and (ii) until the Superintendent's successor is appointed and qualified. The Superintendent shall devote 15 16 his or her full time to the duties of the office, shall not 17 serve in any other capacity during his or her term of office, and shall receive such compensation as the Governor shall 18 19 determine. The Superintendent shall have an administrative 20 certificate with a superintendent endorsement as provided for under Section 21-7.1 of the School Code, and shall have <u>a</u> 21 22 degree in educational administration, together with at least 23 10 years of experience in either deaf or hard of hearing 24 education, the administration of deaf or hard of hearing 25 education, or a combination of the 2. Preference shall be given to candidates with a degree in deaf education. The 26

Superintendent must be fluent in American Sign Language degrees in both educational administration and deaf education, together with at least 15 years of experience in either deaf education, the administration of deaf education, or a combination of the 2.

(a-10) The Superintendent of the Illinois School for the 6 7 Visually Impaired shall be the chief executive officer of, and 8 shall be responsible for the day to day operations of, the 9 School. and shall obtain educational and professional 10 employees who are certified by the Illinois State Board of 11 Education or licensed by the appropriate agency or entity to 12 which licensing authority has been delegated, as well as all 13 other employees of the School, subject to the provisions of the Personnel Code and any applicable collective bargaining 14 agreement. The Superintendent shall be appointed by the 15 16 Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. In 17 the case of a vacancy in the office of Superintendent during the recess of the Senate, the Governor shall make a temporary 18 appointment until the next meeting of the Senate, when the 19 20 Governor shall nominate some person to fill the office, and any person so nominated who is confirmed by the Senate shall 21 22 hold office during the remainder of the term and until his or 23 her successor is appointed and qualified. The Superintendent shall hold office (i) for a term expiring on June 30 of 2015, 24 25 every 4 years thereafter and (ii) until the and 26 Superintendent's successor is appointed and qualified. The

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Superintendent shall devote his or her full time to the duties 1 2 of the office, shall not serve in any other capacity during his or her term of office, and shall receive such compensation as 3 the Governor shall determine. The Superintendent shall have an 4 5 administrative certificate with a superintendent endorsement as provided for under Section 21-7.1 of the School Code, and 6 shall have a degree in educational administration, together 7 8 with at least 10 years of experience in either blind or 9 visually impaired education, the administration of blind or visually impaired education, or a combination of the 2. 10 11 Preference shall be given to candidates with a degree in blind 12 or visually impaired education. degrees in both educational administration and blind or visually impaired education, 13 together with at least 15 years of experience in either blind 14 or visually impaired education, the administration of blind or 15 16 visually impaired education, or a combination of the 2.

17 (b) In administering the Illinois School for the Deaf, the Department shall adopt an admission policy which permits day 18 or residential enrollment, when resources are sufficient, of 19 20 children with hearing disabilities who are able to take advantage of the regular educational facilities provided in 21 22 the community and thus unqualified for admission under 23 subsection (a). In doing so, the Department shall establish an annual deadline by which shall be completed the enrollment of 24 25 children qualified under subsection (a) for admission to the 26 Illinois School for the Deaf. After the deadline, the Illinois

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School for the Deaf may enroll other children with hearing 1 2 disabilities at the request of their parents or guardians if the Department determines there are sufficient resources to 3 meet their needs as well as the needs of children enrolled 4 5 before the deadline and children qualified under subsection 6 (a) who may be enrolled after the deadline on an emergency 7 basis. The Department shall adopt any rules and regulations 8 necessary for the implementation of this subsection.

9 (c) In administering the Illinois School for the Visually 10 Impaired, the Department shall adopt an admission policy that 11 permits day or residential enrollment, when resources are 12 sufficient, of children with visual disabilities who are able 13 to take advantage of the regular educational facilities 14 provided in the community and thus unqualified for admission 15 under subsection (a). In doing so, the Department shall 16 establish an annual deadline by which the enrollment of 17 children qualified under subsection (a) for admission to the Illinois School for the Visually Impaired shall be completed. 18 19 After the deadline, the Illinois School for the Visually 20 Impaired may enroll other children with visual disabilities at the request of their parents or guardians if the Department 21 22 determines there are sufficient resources to meet their needs 23 as well as the needs of children enrolled before the deadline and children qualified under subsection (a) 24 who mav be 25 enrolled after the deadline on an emergency basis.
