2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 1874 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section 21B-20 as follows:
6	(105 ILCS 5/21B-20)
7	Sec. 21B-20. Types of licenses. The State Board of
8	Education shall implement a system of educator licensure,
9	whereby individuals employed in school districts who are
10	required to be licensed must have one of the following
11	licenses: (i) a professional educator license; (ii) an
12	educator license with stipulations; (iii) a substitute
13	teaching license; or (iv) until June 30, 2023, a short-term
14	substitute teaching license. References in law regarding
15	individuals certified or certificated or required to be
16	certified or certificated under Article 21 of this Code shall

also include individuals licensed or required to be licensed
 under this Article. The first year of all licenses ends on June
 30 following one full year of the license being issued.

The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, may adopt such rules as may be necessary to govern the requirements for licenses and endorsements under this Section.

(1) Professional Educator License. Persons who 8 (i) 9 have successfully completed an approved educator 10 preparation program and are recommended for licensure by the Illinois institution offering the educator preparation 11 program, (ii) have successfully completed the required 12 testing under Section 21B-30 of this Code, (iii) have 13 14 successfully completed coursework on the psychology of, 15 the identification of, and the methods of instruction for exceptional child, including without 16 the limitation 17 children with learning disabilities, (iv) have successfully completed coursework in methods of reading 18 19 and reading in the content area, and (v) have met all other 20 criteria established by rule of the State Board of Education shall be issued a Professional Educator License. 21 All Professional Educator Licenses are valid until June 30 22 23 immediately following 5 years of the license being issued. 24 The Professional Educator License shall be endorsed with 25 specific areas and grade levels in which the individual is 26 eligible to practice. For an early childhood education 10200HB1874ham001 -3- LRB102 13153 CMG 25246 a

1 individual may satisfy the student endorsement, an teaching requirement of his or her early childhood teacher 2 3 preparation program through placement in a setting with children from birth through grade 2, and the individual 4 5 may be paid and receive credit while student teaching. The student teaching experience must meet the requirements of 6 7 be approved by the individual's early childhood and 8 teacher preparation program.

9 Individuals can receive subsequent endorsements on the 10 Professional Educator License. Subsequent endorsements 11 shall require a minimum of 24 semester hours of coursework 12 in the endorsement area and passage of the applicable 13 content area test, unless otherwise specified by rule.

14 (2) Educator License with Stipulations. An Educator
15 License with Stipulations shall be issued an endorsement
16 that limits the license holder to one particular position
17 or does not require completion of an approved educator
18 program or both.

An individual with an Educator License with Stipulations must not be employed by a school district or any other entity to replace any presently employed teacher who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason.

An Educator License with Stipulations may be issuedwith the following endorsements:

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(A) (Blank).

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(B) Alternative provisional educator.

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alternative provisional educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who, at the time of applying for the endorsement, has done all of the following:

5 (i) Graduated from a regionally accredited 6 college or university with a minimum of a 7 bachelor's degree.

8 (ii) Successfully completed the first phase of 9 the Alternative Educator Licensure Program for 10 Teachers, as described in Section 21B-50 of this 11 Code.

12 (iii) Passed a content area test, as required13 under Section 21B-30 of this Code.

The alternative provisional educator endorsement is valid for 2 years of teaching and may be renewed for a third year by an individual meeting the requirements set forth in Section 21B-50 of this Code.

(C) Alternative provisional superintendent. An 18 19 alternative provisional superintendent endorsement on 20 an Educator License with Stipulations entitles the 21 holder to serve only as a superintendent or assistant superintendent in a school district's central office. 22 23 This endorsement may only be issued to an applicant 24 who, at the time of applying for the endorsement, has 25 done all of the following:

(i) Graduated from a regionally accredited

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college or university with a minimum of a master's 1 degree in a management field other than education. 2 3 (ii) Been employed for a period of at least 5 years in a management level position in a field 4 5 other than education. (iii) Successfully completed the first phase 6 7 of alternative route to superintendent an 8 endorsement program, as provided in Section 21B-55 9 of this Code. 10 (iv) Passed a content area test required under Section 21B-30 of this Code. 11 The endorsement is valid for 2 fiscal years in 12 13 order to complete one full year of serving as a 14 superintendent or assistant superintendent. 15 (D) (Blank). 16 (E) Career and technical educator. A career and technical educator endorsement on an Educator License 17 18 with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who has a minimum of 60 semester hours of coursework from a 19 20 regionally accredited institution of higher education or an accredited trade and technical institution and 21 22 has a minimum of 2,000 hours of experience outside of 23 education in each area to be taught.

The career and technical educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the 1

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endorsement being issued and may be renewed.

An individual who holds a valid career and technical educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations but does not hold a bachelor's degree may substitute teach in career and technical education classrooms.

(F) Part-time provisional career and technical 7 8 educator or provisional career and technical educator. 9 A part-time provisional career and technical educator 10 endorsement or a provisional career and technical 11 educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who has a 12 13 minimum of 8,000 hours of work experience in the skill 14 for which the applicant is seeking the endorsement. It 15 is the responsibility of each employing school board 16 and regional office of education to provide 17 verification, in writing, to the State Superintendent 18 of Education at the time the application is submitted 19 that no qualified teacher holding a Professional 20 Educator License or an Educator License with 21 Stipulations with a career and technical educator 22 endorsement is available and that actual circumstances 23 require such issuance.

24 The provisional career and technical educator 25 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 26 is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the endorsement being issued and may be renewed for
 5 years.

3 A part-time provisional career and technical educator endorsement on an Educator License with 4 5 Stipulations may be issued for teaching no more than 2 courses of study for grades 6 through 12. 6 The part-time provisional career and technical educator 7 8 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 9 is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years 10 of the endorsement being issued and may be renewed for 11 5 years if the individual makes application for 12 renewal.

An individual who holds a provisional or part-time provisional career and technical educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations but does not hold a bachelor's degree may substitute teach in career and technical education classrooms.

18 Transitional bilingual educator. (G) А 19 transitional bilingual educator endorsement on an 20 Educator License with Stipulations may be issued for 21 the purpose of providing instruction in accordance 22 with Article 14C of this Code to an applicant who 23 provides satisfactory evidence that he or she meets 24 all of the following requirements:

(i) Possesses adequate speaking, reading, and
 writing ability in the language other than English

in which transitional bilingual education is
 offered.

3 (ii) Has the ability to successfully4 communicate in English.

5 (iii) Either possessed, within 5 vears previous to his or her applying for a transitional 6 7 bilingual educator endorsement, a valid and 8 comparable teaching certificate or comparable 9 authorization issued by a foreign country or holds 10 a degree from an institution of higher learning in 11 country that the Educator foreign State а 12 Preparation and Licensure Board determines to be 13 the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a 14 regionally accredited institution of higher 15 learning in the United States.

A transitional bilingual educator endorsement shall be valid for prekindergarten through grade 12, is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the endorsement being issued, and shall not be renewed.

Persons holding a transitional bilingual educator endorsement shall not be employed to replace any presently employed teacher who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason.

(H) Language endorsement. In an effort toalleviate the shortage of teachers speaking a language

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other than English in the public schools, 1 an individual who holds an Educator License with 2 3 Stipulations may also apply for а language endorsement, provided that the applicant provides 4 5 satisfactory evidence that he or she meets all of the following requirements: 6

7 (i) Holds a transitional bilingual
8 endorsement.

9 (ii) Has demonstrated proficiency in the 10 language for which the endorsement is to be issued 11 by passing the applicable language content test 12 required by the State Board of Education.

(iii) Holds a bachelor's degree or higher from 13 14 a regionally accredited institution of higher 15 education or, for individuals educated in a 16 country other than the United States, holds a degree from an institution of higher learning in a 17 18 foreign country that the State Educator 19 Preparation and Licensure Board determines to be 20 the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a 21 regionally accredited institution of higher 22 learning in the United States.

(iv) (Blank).

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A language endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for prekindergarten through grade 12 for the same validity period as the

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individual's transitional bilingual educator
 endorsement on the Educator License with Stipulations
 and shall not be renewed.

4 (I) Visiting international educator. A visiting 5 international educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to 6 an individual who is being recruited by a particular 7 school district that conducts formal recruitment 8 9 programs outside of the United States to secure the 10 services of qualified teachers and who meets all of 11 the following requirements:

12 (i) Holds the equivalent of a minimum of a13 bachelor's degree issued in the United States.

(ii) Has been prepared as a teacher at the grade level for which he or she will be employed.

16 (iii) Has adequate content knowledge in the17 subject to be taught.

18 (iv) Has an adequate command of the English19 language.

A holder of a visiting international educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations shall be permitted to teach in bilingual education programs in the language that was the medium of instruction in his or her teacher preparation program, provided that he or she passes the English Language Proficiency Examination or another test of writing 1

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skills in English identified by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board.

A visiting international educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for 5 years and shall not be renewed.

(J) Paraprofessional educator. A paraprofessional 7 8 educator endorsement on an Educator License with 9 Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who holds a 10 high school diploma or its recognized equivalent and 11 either holds an associate's degree or a minimum of 60 semester hours of credit from a regionally accredited 12 13 institution of higher education or has passed a 14 paraprofessional competency test under subsection 15 (c-5) of Section 21B-30. The paraprofessional educator 16 endorsement is valid until June 30 immediately 17 following 5 years of the endorsement being issued and 18 may be renewed through application and payment of the appropriate fee, as required under Section 21B-40 of 19 20 this Code. An individual who holds only a 21 paraprofessional educator endorsement is not subject to additional requirements in order to renew the 22 23 endorsement.

(K) Chief school business official. A chief school
business official endorsement on an Educator License
with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who

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qualifies by having a master's degree or higher, 2 1 years of full-time administrative experience in school 2 business management or 2 years of university-approved 3 practical experience, and a minimum of 24 semester 4 5 hours of graduate credit in a program approved by the State Board of Education for the preparation of school 6 7 business administrators and by passage of the 8 applicable State tests, including an applicable 9 content area test.

10 The chief school business official endorsement may 11 also be affixed to the Educator License with Stipulations of any holder who qualifies by having a 12 13 master's degree in business administration, finance, 14 accounting, or public administration and who completes 15 an additional 6 semester hours of internship in school 16 business management from a regionally accredited institution of higher education and passes the 17 18 applicable State tests, including an applicable 19 content area test. This endorsement shall be required 20 for any individual employed as a chief school business official. 21

The chief school business official endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the endorsement being issued and may be renewed if the license holder completes renewal requirements as 10200HB1874ham001

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required for individuals who hold a Professional
 Educator License endorsed for chief school business
 official under Section 21B-45 of this Code and such
 rules as may be adopted by the State Board of
 Education.

6 The State Board of Education shall adopt any rules 7 necessary to implement Public Act 100-288.

8 (L) Provisional in-state educator. A provisional 9 in-state educator endorsement on an Educator License 10 with Stipulations may be issued to a candidate who has 11 completed an Illinois-approved educator preparation program at an Illinois institution of higher education 12 13 and who has not successfully completed an evidence-based assessment of teacher effectiveness but 14 15 who meets all of the following requirements:

(i) Holds at least a bachelor's degree.

17 (ii) Has completed an approved educator
 18 preparation program at an Illinois institution.

(iii) Has passed an applicable content area test, as required by Section 21B-30 of this Code.

21 (iv) attempted evidence-based Has an assessment of teacher effectiveness and received a 22 23 minimum score on that assessment, as established 24 by the State Board of Education in consultation 25 with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure 26 Board.

A provisional in-state educator endorsement on an 1 Educator License with Stipulations is valid for one full fiscal year after the date of issuance and may not be renewed.

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(N) Specialized services. A specialized services 6 7 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 8 may be issued as defined and specified by rule.

9 (3) Substitute Teaching License. A Substitute Teaching 10 License may be issued to qualified applicants for substitute teaching in all grades of the public schools, 11 prekindergarten through grade 12. Substitute Teaching 12 13 Licenses are not eligible for endorsements. Applicants for 14 a Substitute Teaching License must hold a bachelor's 15 degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution of higher education. 16

Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for 5 years.

Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for substitute 18 19 teaching in every county of this State. If an individual 20 has had his or her Professional Educator License or 21 Educator License with Stipulations suspended or revoked, 22 then that individual is not eligible to obtain a 23 Substitute Teaching License.

24 A substitute teacher may only teach in the place of a 25 licensed teacher who is under contract with the employing 26 board. If, however, there is no licensed teacher under 10200HB1874ham001 -15- LRB102 13153 CMG 25246 a

1 contract because of an emergency situation, then a district may employ a substitute teacher for no longer 2 3 than 30 calendar days per each vacant position in the district if the district notifies the appropriate regional 4 5 office of education within 5 business days after the employment of the substitute teacher in the emergency 6 situation. An emergency situation is one in which an 7 8 unforeseen vacancy has occurred and (i) a teacher is 9 unable to fulfill his or her contractual duties or (ii) 10 teacher capacity needs of the district exceed previous 11 indications, and the district is actively engaged in advertising to hire a fully licensed teacher for the 12 13 vacant position.

14 There is no limit on the number of days that a 15 substitute teacher may teach in a single school district, 16 provided that no substitute teacher may teach for longer than 90 school days for any one licensed teacher under 17 18 contract in the same school year. A substitute teacher who holds a Professional Educator License or Educator License 19 20 with Stipulations shall not teach for more than 120 school 21 days for any one licensed teacher under contract in the 22 same school year. The limitations in this paragraph (3) on 23 the number of days a substitute teacher may be employed do 24 not apply to any school district operating under Article 25 34 of this Code.

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A school district may not require an individual who

holds a valid Professional Educator License or Educator
 License with Stipulations to seek or hold a Substitute
 Teaching License to teach as a substitute teacher.

(4) Short-Term Substitute Teaching License. The 4 Beginning on July 1, 2018 and until June 30, 2023, the 5 State Board of Education may issue a Short-Term Substitute 6 7 Teaching License. A Short-Term Substitute Teaching License 8 may be issued to a qualified applicant for substitute 9 teaching in all grades of the public schools, 10 prekindergarten through grade 12. Short-Term Substitute 11 Teaching Licenses are not eligible for endorsements. Applicants for a Short-Term Substitute Teaching License 12 13 must hold an associate's degree or have completed at least 14 60 credit hours from a regionally accredited institution 15 of higher education.

16 Short-Term Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for 17 substitute teaching in every county of this State. If an 18 individual has had his or her Professional Educator 19 License or Educator License with Stipulations suspended or 20 revoked, then that individual is not eligible to obtain a 21 Short-Term Substitute Teaching License.

The provisions of Sections 10-21.9 and 34-18.5 of this Code apply to short-term substitute teachers.

An individual holding a Short-Term Substitute Teaching License may teach no more than 5 consecutive days per licensed teacher who is under contract. For teacher 10200HB1874ham001 -17- LRB102 13153 CMG 25246 a

absences lasting 6 or more days per licensed teacher who 1 is under contract, a school district may not hire an 2 individual holding a Short-Term Substitute 3 Teaching 4 License. An individual holding a Short-Term Substitute 5 Teaching License must complete the training program under Section 10-20.67 or 34-18.60 of this Code to be eligible 6 to teach at a public school. This paragraph (4) is 7 8 inoperative on and after July 1, 2023.
