SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/11-25

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person also commits grooming when he or she knowingly in person, through direct communication or conduct through a third-party, performs an act to seduce, solicit, lure, or entice, or attempt to seduce, solicit, lure, or entice, a child, a child's guardian, or another person believed by the person to be a child or a child's guardian, to commit any sex offense as defined in the Sex Offender Registration Act, to distribute photographs depicting the sex organs of the child, or to otherwise engage in any unlawful sexual conduct with a child or with another person believed by the person to be a child.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by changing Section 11-25 as follows:

- 7 Sec. 11-25. Grooming.
- (a) A person commits grooming when he or she knowingly 8 9 uses a computer on-line service, Internet service, local bulletin board service, or any other device capable of 10 electronic data storage or transmission to seduce, solicit, 11 lure, or entice, or attempt to seduce, solicit, lure, or 12 entice, a child, a child's quardian, or another person 13 14 believed by the person to be a child or a child's quardian, to commit any sex offense as defined in Section 2 of the Sex 15 16 Offender Registration Act, to distribute photographs depicting the sex organs of the child, or to otherwise engage in any 17 unlawful sexual conduct with a child or with another person 18 19 believed by the person to be a child. As used in this Section,
 - in person, through direct communication or conduct through a third-party, performs an act to seduce, solicit, lure, or
