Amends the Illinois Municipal Code. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning auxiliary police officers.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning local government.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by
5 changing Section 3.1-30-20 as follows:

6 (65 ILCS 5/3.1-30-20) (from Ch. 24, par. 3.1-30-20)

7 Sec. 3.1-30-20. Auxiliary police officers.

8 (a) Auxiliary police officers shall not be members of the
9 ~~the~~ regular police department of the municipality. Auxiliary
10 police officers shall not supplement members of the regular
11 police department of any municipality in the performance of
12 their assigned and normal duties, except as otherwise provided
13 in this Code. Auxiliary police officers shall only be assigned
14 to perform the following duties in a municipality: (i) to aid
15 or direct traffic within the municipality, (ii) to aid in
16 control of natural or man made disasters, and (iii) to aid in
17 case of civil disorder as directed by the chief of police. When
18 it is impractical for members of the regular police department
19 to perform those normal and regular police duties, however,
20 the chief of police of the regular police department may
21 assign auxiliary police officers to perform those normal and
22 regular police duties. Identification symbols worn by
23 auxiliary police officers shall be different and distinct from

1 those used by members of the regular police department.
2 Auxiliary police officers shall at all times during the
3 performance of their duties be subject to the direction and
4 control of the chief of police of the municipality. Auxiliary
5 police officers shall not carry firearms, except with the
6 permission of the chief of police and while in uniform and in
7 the performance of their duties. Auxiliary police officers,
8 when on duty, shall also be conservators of the peace and shall
9 have the powers specified in Section 3.1-15-25.

10 (b) Auxiliary police officers, before entering upon any of
11 their duties, shall receive a course of training in the use of
12 weapons and other police procedures appropriate for the
13 exercise of the powers conferred upon them under this Code.
14 The training and course of study shall be determined and
15 provided by the corporate authorities of each municipality
16 employing auxiliary police officers. Before being permitted to
17 carry a firearm, however, an auxiliary police officer must
18 have the same course of training as required of peace officers
19 under Section 2 of the Peace Officer and Probation Officer
20 Firearm Training Act. The municipal authorities may require
21 that all auxiliary police officers be residents of the
22 municipality served by them. Before the appointment of an
23 auxiliary police officer, the person's fingerprints shall be
24 taken, and no person shall be appointed as an auxiliary police
25 officer if that person has been convicted of a felony or other
26 crime involving moral turpitude.

1 (c) The Line of Duty Compensation Act shall be applicable
2 to auxiliary police officers upon their death in the line of
3 duty described in this Code.
