SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-20.9a from Ch. 122, par. 10-20.9a

Amends the School Code. Makes a technical change in a provision concerning promoting students to the next higher grade level.

AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
10-20.9a as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.9a) (from Ch. 122, par. 10-20.9a)

7 Sec. 10-20.9a. Final grade; promotion.

(a) Teachers shall administer the the approved marking 8 9 system or other approved means of evaluating pupil progress. The teacher shall maintain the responsibility and right to 10 determine grades and other evaluations of students within the 11 12 grading policies of the district based upon his or her 13 professional judgment of available criteria pertinent to any 14 given subject area or activity for which he or she is responsible. District policy shall provide the procedure and 15 16 reasons by and for which a grade may be changed; provided that no grade or evaluation shall be changed without notification 17 to the teacher concerning the nature and reasons for such 18 19 change. If such a change is made, the person making the change shall assume such responsibility for determining the grade or 20 21 evaluation, and shall initial such change.

22 (b) School districts shall not promote students to the 23 next higher grade level based upon age or any other social

reasons not related to the academic performance of the 1 2 students. On or before September 1, 1998, school boards shall 3 adopt and enforce a policy on promotion as they deem necessary to ensure that students meet local goals and objectives and 4 5 can perform at the expected grade level prior to promotion. Decisions to promote or retain students in any classes shall 6 7 based on successful completion of the curriculum, be 8 attendance, performance based on the assessments required 9 under Section 2-3.64a-5 of this Code, the Iowa Test of Basic 10 Skills, or other testing or any other criteria established by 11 the school board. Students determined by the local district to 12 not qualify for promotion to the next higher grade shall be provided remedial assistance, which may include, but shall not 13 be limited to, a summer bridge program of no less than 90 14 sessions, increased or 15 hours, tutorial concentrated 16 instructional time, modifications to instructional materials, and retention in grade. 17
