

102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB2474

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 3305/7.3 new

Amends the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act. Provides that no occupational or professional license issued by any State agency to a business or person may be revoked or suspended based upon a failure to comply with an executive order related to the COVID-19 Pandemic, unless a court order has been obtained to allow such license revocation or suspension. Provides that no State agency or employee of that State agency may enter on to the premises of a business or person for the purpose of effectuating the revocation or suspension of an occupational or professional license based upon a failure to comply with an executive order related to the COVID-19 Pandemic, unless a court order has been obtained to allow the enforcing State agency to enter on to the premises for such purpose and notice has been provided to the relevant State legislators of the district in which the business or person resides. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act is amended by adding Section 7.3 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 3305/7.3 new)
- Sec. 7.3. Emergency powers related to the COVID-19

 8 Pandemic; licensure revocation prohibited.
- 9 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law or executive order to the contrary, no occupational or professional license 10 issued by any State agency to a business or person may be 11 12 revoked or suspended based upon a failure to comply with an executive order related to the COVID-19 Pandemic that is 13 14 issued by the Governor under Section 7, unless a court order has been obtained to allow such license revocation or 15 16 suspension on grounds independent of failure to comply with 17 the provisions of the executive order.
- 18 (b) Notwithstanding any provision of law or executive

 19 order to the contrary, no State agency or employee of that

 20 State agency may enter on to the premises of a business or

 21 person for the purpose of effectuating the revocation or

 22 suspension of an occupational or professional license, or

 23 related matters, based upon a failure to comply with an

- executive order related to the COVID-19 Pandemic that is
 issued by the Governor under Section 7, unless a court order
 has been obtained to allow the enforcing State agency to enter
 on to the premises for such purpose and the relevant State
 legislators of the district in which the business or person
 resides have been provide with at least 30 days notice prior to
 entrance.
- 8 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
