A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
8 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
11 Multi-Modal Transportation Bond Fund, and the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-
13 exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State.

14 ARTICLE 2

15 Section 1. "An ACT making appropriations", Public Act 101-
16 0638, approved June 12, 2020, is amended by changing Section
17 52 of Article 12 as follows:

18 (P.A. 101-0638, Article 12, Section 52)

19 Sec. 52. The sum of \$446,739,810, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal/State/Local
21 Airport Fund to the Department of Transportation for airport

1 funding as laid out in the CARES ACT Funding for Aviation,
2 including prior incurred costs.

3 ARTICLE 3

4 Section 1. "An ACT making appropriations", Public Act 101-
5 0638, approved June 12, 2020, is amended by changing Section
6 225 of Article 44 as follows:

7 (P.A. 101-0638, Article 44, Section 225)

8 Sec. 225. The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation Bond
10 Series A Fund to the Department of Transportation ~~Opportunity~~
11 for a grant to the City of Countryside for costs associated
12 with infrastructure improvements to Route 66.

13 ARTICLE 4

14 Section 5. "AN ACT concerning appropriations", Public Act
15 101-0638, approved June 12, 2020, is amended by adding Section
16 42 and repealing Section 10 and 15 to Article 18 as follows:

17 (P.A. 101-0638, Article 18, Section 42, new)

18 Section 42. The sum of \$59,680,944, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
20 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for use pursuant
21 to Section 22.2 of the Environmental Protection Act as

1 authorized by subsection (d) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois
2 Bond Act, including costs in prior years.

3 (P.A. 101-0638, Article 18, Section 10, rep.)

4 Section 5. Section 10 of Article 18 of Public Act 101-
5 0638, approved June 12, 2020, is repealed.

6 (P.A. 101-0638, Article 18, Section 15, rep.)

7 Section 5. Section 15 of Article 18 of Public Act 101-
8 0638, approved June 12, 2020, is repealed.

9 ARTICLE 5

10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
13 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
14 such purpose in Article 8, Section 5 of Public Act 101-0638,
15 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
16 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a grant
17 to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
18 improvements, including prior incurred costs.

19 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose in Article 8, Section 10 of Public Act 101-0638,
3 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
6 including prior incurred costs.

7 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
10 such purpose in Article 8, Section 15 of Public Act 101-0638,
11 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
14 including prior incurred costs.

15 Section 25. The sum of \$9,289,975, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
18 such purpose in Article 8, Section 25 of Public Act 101-0638,
19 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
20 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
21 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park, including
22 prior incurred costs.

1 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 8, Section 30 of Public Act 101-0638,
5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
8 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act, including prior
9 incurred costs.

10 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 8, Section 40 of Public Act 101-0638,
14 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
16 grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the
17 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
18 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois, and
19 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section
20 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
21 agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

22 Section 50. The sum of \$25,425,171, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose in Article 8, Section 50 of Public Act 101-0638,
3 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
6 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
7 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
8 such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

9 Section 55. The sum of \$8,688,072, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose in Article 8, Section 55 of Public Act 101-0638,
13 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
16 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
17 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
18 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
19 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
20 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
21 prior incurred costs.

22 Section 60. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose in Article 8, Section 60 of Public Act 101-0638,
3 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
6 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
7 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
8 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
9 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
10 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
11 prior incurred costs.

12 Section 65. The sum of \$985,642, or so much thereof as may
13 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 8, Section 65 of Public Act 101-0638,
16 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
18 grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts,
19 including prior incurred costs.

20 Section 71. The sum of \$391,999,111, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
22 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
23 such purpose in Article 8, Section 71 of Public Act 101-0638,

1 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
2 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
3 purpose of making grants and loans to foster economic
4 development and increase employment and the well-being of the
5 citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
6 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and
7 for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including prior
8 incurred costs.

9 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose in Article 8, Section 75 of Public Act 101-0638,
13 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
16 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
17 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
18 distance learning, and public safety, including prior incurred
19 costs.

20 Section 80. The sum of \$15,080,745, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
22 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
23 such purpose in Article 8, Section 80 of Public Act 101-0638,

1 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
2 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
4 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
5 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
6 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
7 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
8 machinery and equipment, including prior incurred costs.

9 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose in Article 8, Section 90 of Public Act 101-0638,
13 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
15 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
16 hospital renovation and equipment, including prior incurred
17 costs.

18 Section 95. The sum of \$1,859,597, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose in Article 8, Section 95 of Public Act 101-0638,
22 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
23 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
2 including prior incurred costs.

3 Section 100. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
5 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
6 such purpose in Article 8, Section 100 of Public Act 101-0638,
7 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
8 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
9 grants for acquisition, construction, renovation and equipping
10 new charter schools, to a silver certification from the United
11 States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and
12 Environmental Design Green Building Rating System as
13 approximated below:

14 For Instituto Del Progresso Latino,
15 including prior incurred costs9,000,000

16 Section 105. The sum of \$2,606,686, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
18 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
19 such purpose in Article 8, Section 105 of Public Act 101-0638,
20 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
21 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to
22 provide grants, loans, and other investments to emerging
23 technology enterprises to support and encourage: (i)

1 commercialization of technology based products and services;
2 (ii) technology transfer projects involving the promotion of
3 new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research and
4 development projects to respond to unique, advanced technology
5 projects and which foster the development of Illinois' economy
6 through the advancement of the State's economic, scientific,
7 and technological assets, including prior incurred costs.

8 Section 110. The sum of \$5,938,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
11 such purpose in Article 8, Section 110 of Public Act 101-0638,
12 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to
14 provide grants for land acquisition, infrastructure, equipment
15 and other permissible capital expenditures to businesses that
16 will encourage new investment and the creation or retention of
17 jobs in economically depressed areas of the State, including
18 prior incurred costs.

19 Section 115. The sum of \$3,301,210, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 8, Section 115 of Public Act 101-0638,
23 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
2 grant to the University of Chicago Medical Center for costs
3 associated with Provident Hospital, including prior incurred
4 costs.

5 Section 120. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
7 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
8 such purpose in Article 8, Section 120 of Public Act 101-0638,
9 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
10 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
11 grant to the Cook County Health and Hospital System for costs
12 associated with medical equipment and capital improvements at
13 Provident Hospital, including prior incurred costs.

14 Section 125. The sum of \$11,349,664, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
16 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
17 such purpose in Article 8, Section 125 of Public Act 101-0638,
18 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 grants awarded in conjunction with the Office of Minority
21 Economic Empowerment, including prior incurred costs.

22 Section 130. The sum of \$2, or so much thereof as may be

1 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on
2 June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such
3 purpose in Article 8, Section 130 of Public Act 101-0638, as
4 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
5 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 costs associated with the Cairo Port Development, including
7 prior incurred costs.

8 Section 135. The sum of \$170,370, or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
11 such purpose in Article 8, Section 135 of Public Act 101-0638,
12 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
14 grant to Erie Neighborhood House, including prior incurred
15 costs.

16 Section 140. The sum of \$512, or so much thereof as may be
17 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on
18 June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such
19 purpose in Article 8, Section 140 of Public Act 101-0638, as
20 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund

15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2021, from appropriations heretofore made
17 for such purpose in Article 8, Section 170 of Public Act 101-
18 0638, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
19 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to local
21 governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
22 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
23 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other

1 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build
2 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
3 purposes, including prior incurred costs.

4 Section 175. The sum of \$68,791,541, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
6 on June 30, 2021, from appropriations heretofore made for such
7 purpose in Article 8, Section 175 of Public Act 101-0638, as
8 amended is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
9 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
10 purpose of making grants and loans to local governments for
11 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
12 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
13 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
14 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
15 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
16 prior incurred costs.

17 Section 180. The sum of \$175,000,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purpose in Article 8, Section 180 of Public Act
21 101-0638, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to foster

1 economic development and increase employment and the well-being
2 of the citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes
3 authorized in subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois
4 Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such purposes,
5 including prior incurred costs.

6 Section 185. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2021, from appropriations heretofore made for such
9 purpose in Article 8, Section 185 of Public Act 101-0638, as
10 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
11 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
13 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
14 purposes, including prior incurred costs.

15 Section 190. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2021, from appropriations heretofore made for such

19 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund

1 Section 195. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Rebuild Illinois
6 Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for purposes authorized in subsection (c) of
8 Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to
9 State agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred
10 costs.

11 Section 200. The sum of \$99,629,249, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
13 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
14 such purpose in Article 8, Section 200 of Public Act 101-0638,
15 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
16 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
17 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
18 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
19 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
20 distance learning, and public safety, including prior incurred
21 costs.

22 Section 205. The sum of \$300,000,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made for such purpose in Article 8, Section 205 of Public Act
4 101-0638, as amended, is reappropriated from the Rebuild
5 Illinois Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and
6 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans including but not
7 limited to broadband deployment to expand and strengthen
8 existing broadband network infrastructure, health information
9 technology, telemedicine, distance learning, and public safety,
10 including prior incurred costs.

11 Section 210. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
13 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
14 such purpose in Article 8, Section 210 of Public Act 101-0638,
15 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
16 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to
17 provide grants, loans, and other investments to foster economic
18 development for emerging technology enterprises to support and
19 encourage: (i) commercialization of technology based products
20 and services; (ii) technology transfer projects involving the

8 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
9 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to
10 provide grants for land acquisition, infrastructure, equipment
11 and other permissible capital expenditures to businesses that
12 will encourage new investment and the creation or retention of
13 jobs in economically depressed areas of the State, including
14 prior incurred costs.

15 Section 220. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for

19 as amended, is reappropriated from the Rebuild Illinois
20 Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for grants awarded in conjunction with the Office
22 of Minority Economic Empowerment, including prior incurred
23 costs.

1 Section 225. The sum of \$26,900,000, or so much thereof as

17 Section 5. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may
18 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
19 to the Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
20 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the Agency's
21 operational expenses.

1 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as may
2 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
3 to the Department of Natural Resources for the administration
4 and payment of grants to local governmental units for the
5 construction, maintenance, and improvement of boat access
6 areas.

7 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as may
8 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
9 to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the
10 Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
11 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
12 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
13 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
14 areas.

15 Section 20. To the extent federal funds, including
16 reimbursements, are available for such purposes, the sum of
17 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated
18 from the State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural
19 Resources for all costs for construction and development of
20 facilities for transient, non-trailerable recreational boats,
21 including grants for such purposes authorized under the Boating
22 Infrastructure Grant Program.

1 Section 25. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
3 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for multiple use
4 facilities and programs for boating purposes provided by the
5 Department of Natural Resources, including construction and
6 development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land
7 acquisition, services, studies and all other expenses required
8 to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

9 Section 30. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Parks Fund to the
11 Department of Natural Resources for matching recreational
12 trails and trail-related projects authorized under the
13 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991,
14 multiple use facilities and programs for park and trail
15 purposes provided by the Department of Natural Resources,
16 including construction and development, all costs for supplies,
17 materials, labor, land acquisition, services, studies, and all
18 other expenses required to comply with the intent of this
19 appropriation.

20 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
21 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund
22 to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition and

1 development, including grants, for the implementation of the
2 North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion
3 of Canada or the United States which specifically provides
4 waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

5 Section 40. To the extent federal funds including
6 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
7 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
8 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department
9 of Natural Resources for construction and renovation of waste
10 reception facilities for recreational boaters, including grants
11 for such purposes authorized under the Clean Vessel Act.

12 Section 45. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may
13 be necessary, made either independently or in cooperation with
14 the Federal Government or any agency thereof, any municipal
15 corporation, or political subdivision of the State, or with any
16 public or private corporation, organization, or individual, is
17 appropriated from the Forest Reserve Fund to the Department of
18 Natural Resources for refunds and for the U.S. Forest Service
19 Program.

20 Section 50. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
21 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Furbearer Fund to
22 the Department of Natural Resources for the conservation of fur

1 bearing mammals in accordance with the provisions of Section
2 5/1.32 of the Wildlife Code, as now or hereafter amended.

3 Section 55. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Natural Areas
5 Acquisition Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
6 acquisition, preservation and stewardship of natural areas,
7 including habitats for endangered and threatened species, high
8 quality natural communities, wetlands and other areas with
9 unique or unusual natural heritage qualities.

10 Section 60. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as
11 maybe necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant Fund
12 to the Department of Natural Resources for the conservation of
13 pheasants in accordance with the provisions of Section 5/1.31
14 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter amended.

15 Section 65. The sum of \$1,350,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
17 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
18 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
19 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment Act",
20 as now or hereafter amended.

21 Section 70. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may

1 be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat Fund
2 to the Department of Natural Resources for the preservation and
3 maintenance of a high quality fish and wildlife habitat and to
4 promote the heritage of outdoor sports in Illinois from revenue
5 derived from the sale of Sportsmen Series license plates.

6 Section 75. The sum of \$3,500,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, made either independently or in cooperation
8 with the Federal Government or any agency thereof, any
9 municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the State,
10 or with any public or private corporation, organization, or
11 individual, is appropriated from the Land and Water Recreation
12 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for refunds and for
13 outdoor recreation programs.

14 Section 80. The sum of \$350,000, or so much thereof as may
15 be necessary, is appropriated from the Off-Highway Vehicle
16 Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants
17 to units of local governments, not-for-profit organizations,
18 and other groups to operate, maintain and acquire land for off-
19 highway vehicle trails and parks as provided for in the
20 Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, including administration,
21 enforcement, planning and implementation of this Act.

22 Section 85. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as may

1 be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
2 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
3 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
4 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
5 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and for
6 the use of snowmobiles.

7 Section 90. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may
8 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
9 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
10 the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
11 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
12 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
13 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the Wildlife
14 Code, as amended.

15 Section 95. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
17 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
18 the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl
19 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United
20 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the Mississippi
21 Flyway as provided in the Wildlife Code, as amended.

22 Section 100. The sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
2 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
3 the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
4 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

5 Section 105. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
7 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
8 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
9 development of bike paths.

10 Section 110. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
12 Resources from the Park and Conservation Fund for multiple use
13 facilities and programs for park and trail purposes provided
14 by the Department of Natural Resources, including construction
15 and development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor,
16 land, acquisition, services, studies, and all other expenses
17 required to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

18 Section 115. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
20 Resources from the Park and Conservation Fund for multiple use
21 facilities and programs for conservation purposes provided by
22 the Department of Natural Resources, including repairing,

1 maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating, replacing fixed
2 assets, construction and development, marketing and promotions,
3 all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition and
4 its related costs, services, studies, and all other expenses
5 required to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

6 Section 120. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
8 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
9 construction and maintenance of State owned, leased, and
10 managed sites.

11 Section 125. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
13 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
14 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths and
15 all other related expenses connected with the acquisition,
16 development, and maintenance of bike paths.

17 Section 130. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
19 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
20 the development and maintenance, and other related expenses of
21 recreational trails and trail-related projects authorized under
22 the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991,

1 provided such amount shall not exceed funds to be made available
2 for such purposes from State or federal sources.

3 Section 135. The sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may
4 be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
5 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
6 payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
7 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
8 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
9 amended.

10 Section 140. To the extent Federal Funds including
11 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
12 of \$300,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
13 appropriated from the Illinois Forestry Development Fund to the
14 Department of Natural Resources for Forest Stewardship
15 Technical Assistance.

16 Section 145. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Wildlife
18 Preservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
19 the Purposes of the "Illinois Non-Game Wildlife Protection
20 Act".

21 Section 150. The sum of \$375,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
2 Resources from the Adeline Jay Geo-Karis Illinois Beach Marina
3 Fund for rehabilitation, reconstruction, repair, replacing,
4 fixed assets, and improvement of facilities at North Point
5 Marina at Winthrop Harbor.

20 Illinois Arts Council for grants to Riverfront Museum Park &
21 Rockford Art Museum for permanent improvements.

22 Section 165. The sum of \$2,250,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2021, from
2 appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in Article 28,
3 Section 165 of Public Act 101-0638, as amended, is
4 reappropriated from the Rebuild Illinois Projects Fund to the
5 Illinois Arts Council for a grant to South Side Community Art
6 Center for permanent improvements.

7 Section 170. The sum of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2021, from
9 appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in Article 28,

12 Section 5. The sum of \$9,487,411, or so much thereof as may
13 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 29, Section 5 of Public Act 101-0638
16 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
17 to the Department of Innovation and Technology for the Illinois
18 Century Network, and other capital improvements including but
19 not limited to those related to statewide broadband.

20 Section 10. The sum of \$253,095,922, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose in Article 29, Section 10 of Public Act 101-0638,
3 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
4 to the Department of Innovation and Technology for information
5 technology including, but not limited to, Enterprise Resource
6 Planning, and for use by the State, its departments,
7 authorities, public corporations, commissions and agencies as
8 authorized by sub Section (e) of Section 3 of the General
9 Obligation Bond Act.

15 DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

16 Section 5. The sum of \$140,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
18 on June 30, 2021, from the reappropriation heretofore made for
19 such purposes in Article 30, Section 5 of Public Act 101-0638,
20 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
21 to the Department of Revenue for the Illinois Housing
22 Development Authority for affordable housing grants, loans, and

1 investments for low-income families, low-income senior
2 citizens, low-income persons with disabilities and at risk
3 displaced veterans.

4 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
5 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
6 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
7 been approved in writing by the Governor.

8 ARTICLE 999

9 Section 99. Effective Date. This Article and Articles 2
10 through 4 take effect immediately. Article 1 and Articles 5
11 through 25 take effect July 1, 2021.
