

## 102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB2971

Introduced 2/19/2021, by Rep. Thomas Morrison

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.1

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a person under the age of 19 years who holds an instruction permit a graduated license, may use a wireless telephone while driving a vehicle on a roadway if the use of the wireless telephone is for GPS purposes only.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Section 12-610.1 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.1)
- 7 Sec. 12-610.1. Wireless telephones.
- 8 (a) As used in this Section, "wireless telephone" means a
  9 device that is capable of transmitting or receiving telephonic
  10 communications without a wire connecting the device to the
- 11 telephone network.

- 12 (b) Except as provided in subsection (b-1), a A person under the age of 19 years who holds an instruction permit issued under Section 6-105 or 6-107.1, or a person under the age of 19 years who holds a graduated license issued under Section 6-107, may not drive a vehicle on a roadway while using a wireless phone.
  - (b-1) A person under the age of 19 years who holds an instruction permit issued under Section 6-105 or 6-107.1 or a graduated license issued under Section 6-107 may use a wireless telephone while driving a vehicle on a roadway if the use of the wireless telephone is for GPS purposes only.
- 23 (b-5) A person under the age of 19 commits aggravated use

- of a wireless telephone when he or she violates subsection (b)
  and in committing the violation he or she was involved in a
  motor vehicle accident that results in great bodily harm,
  permanent disability, disfigurement, or death to another and
  the violation was a proximate cause of the injury or death.
  - (c) This Section does not apply to a person under the age of 19 years using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.
  - (d) If a graduated driver's license holder over the age of 18 committed an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this Code in the 6 months prior to the graduated driver's license holder's 18th birthday, and was subsequently convicted of the violation, the provisions of paragraph (b) shall continue to apply until such time as a period of 6 consecutive months has elapsed without an additional violation and subsequent conviction of an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this Code.
  - (e) A person, regardless of age, may not use a wireless telephone at any time while operating a motor vehicle on a roadway in a school speed zone established under Section 11-605, on a highway in a construction or maintenance speed

zone established under Section 11-605.1, or within 500 feet of an emergency scene. As used in this Section, "emergency scene" means a location where an authorized emergency vehicle as defined by Section 1-105 of this Code is present and has activated its oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights. This subsection (e) does not apply to (i) a person engaged in a highway construction or maintenance project for which a construction or maintenance speed zone has been established under Section 11-605.1, (ii) a person using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, law enforcement agency, health care provider, department, or other emergency services agency or entity, (iii) a law enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle when performing the officer's or operator's official (iv) a person using a wireless telephone voice-operated mode, which may include the use of a headset, (v) a person using a wireless telephone by pressing a single button to initiate or terminate a voice communication, or (vi) a person using an electronic communication device for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation and continued communication with emergency personnel during the emergency situation.

(e-5) A person commits aggravated use of a wireless telephone when he or she violates subsection (e) and in committing the violation he or she was involved in a motor vehicle accident that results in great bodily harm, permanent

- disability, disfigurement, or death to another and the violation was a proximate cause of the injury or death.
- 3 (f) A person convicted of violating subsection (b-5) or
- 4 (e-5) commits a Class A misdemeanor if the violation resulted
- 5 in great bodily harm, permanent disability, or disfigurement
- 6 to another. A person convicted of violating subsection (b-5)
- 7 or (e-5) commits a Class 4 felony if the violation resulted in
- 8 the death of another person.
