

## 102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB3351

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

25 ILCS 130/8A-35 25 ILCS 130/8A-60 new

Amends the Legislative Commission Reorganization Act of 1984. Provides for the acquisition and placement of statues depicting: (1) President Ronald W. Reagan; and (2) President Barack H. Obama. Provides that the Architect of the Capitol may provide for the design and fabrication of the statues, or may otherwise acquire, using funds collected for such purpose or a statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a suitable statue for placement. Requires the Architect of the Capitol to take actions necessary to provide for the placement and unveiling of the statues within specified periods of time. Requires the Architect of the Capitol to issue a report to the Governor and General Assembly detailing his or her actions in acquiring and placing the statues. Provides that the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain separate accounts for the deposit of funds donated for the payment of expenses associated with the placement of the statues. Provides that the separate accounts may accept deposits from any source, whether private or public, and may be appropriated only for use by the Architect of the Capitol for expenses associated with the acquisition, placement, and maintenance of the statues.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Legislative Commission Reorganization Act
- of 1984 is amended by changing Section 8A-35 and by adding
- 6 Section 8A-60 as follows:

- 10 (a) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund is created as a
- 11 special fund within the State treasury. The Fund may accept
- 12 deposits from any source, whether private or public, and may
- 13 be appropriated only for the use of the Architect of the
- 14 Capitol in the performance of his or her powers and duties. The
- 15 Architect of the Capitol may seek private and public funds for
- deposit into the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund.
- 17 <u>(a-5) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain a</u>
- 18 separate account for the deposit of funds donated for the
- 19 payment of expenses associated with the placement of a
- 20 Presidential Statue on the grounds of the State Capitol
- 21 Building depicting President Ronald W. Reagan, as provided
- 22 under Section 8A-60. The separate account may accept deposits
- 23 from any source, whether private or public, and may be

appropriated only for use by the Architect of the Capitol for expenses associated with the acquisition, placement, and maintenance of the Presidential Statue authorized under subsection (a) of Section 8A-60. The Architect of the Capitol may seek private and public funds for deposit into the separate account of the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund established under this subsection (a-5).

(a-10) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain a separate account for the deposit of funds donated for the payment of expenses associated with the placement of a Presidential Statue on the grounds of the State Capitol Building depicting President Barack H. Obama, as provided under Section 8A-60. The separate account may accept deposits from any source, whether private or public, and may be appropriated only for use by the Architect of the Capitol for expenses associated with the acquisition, placement, and maintenance of the Presidential Statue authorized under subsection (b) of Section 8A-60. The Architect of the Capitol may seek private and public funds for deposit into the separate account of the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund established under this subsection (a-10).

(b) The Architect of the Capitol shall submit all budget requests to implement the master plan that relate to areas of the legislative complex other than the State Capitol Building to the Capitol Historic Preservation Board for review and comment. The Architect of the Capitol shall submit all budget

- 6 (a) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the 7 Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall 8 provide for the acquisition and placement of a statue on the 9 grounds of the State Capitol Building depicting 40th President 10 of the United States Ronald W. Reagan. The Architect of the 11 Capitol may provide for the design and fabrication of the 12 statue, or may otherwise acquire, using funds collected for 13 such purpose or a statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a suitable statue for placement under this 14 15 Section.
  - (b) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall provide for the acquisition and placement of a statue on the grounds of the State Capitol Building depicting 44th President of the United States Barack H. Obama. The Architect of the Capitol may provide for the design and fabrication of the statue, or may otherwise acquire, using funds collected for such purpose or a statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a suitable statue for placement under this Section.

(c) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall take actions necessary to provide for the placement and unveiling of the statues authorized under this Section within a reasonable period of time after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 102nd General Assembly. Prior to the placement of the statues on the grounds of the Capitol, the Architect of the Capitol shall issue a report detailing his or her actions in acquiring and placing the statues specified under this subsection (c). The report shall be delivered to the Governor and the General Assembly.
