

102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB3634

Introduced 2/22/2021, by Rep. Daniel Swanson

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 450/15

Amends the Lyme Disease Prevention and Protection Act. Provides that 2 veterinarians, one of whom must be a practicing Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, and one medical entomologist shall be members of the Lyme Disease Task Force. Removes language providing that the Task Force shall consist of members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate, and the Minority Leader of the Senate. Requires the Task Force to meet not less than 4 (rather than 2) times each year.

1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Lyme Disease Prevention and Protection Act is amended by changing Section 15 as follows:

- 7 Sec. 15. Lyme Disease Task Force; duties; members.
- 8 (a) The Department shall establish the Lyme Disease Task
 9 Force to advise the Department on disease prevention and
 10 surveillance and provider and public education relating to the
 11 disease.
 - (b) The Task Force shall consist of the Director of Public Health or a designee, who shall serve as chairman, and the following members appointed by the Director of Public Health:
 - (1) one representative from the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation, appointed by the Director of Public Health;
 - (2) 3 physicians licensed to practice medicine in all its branches who are members of a statewide organization representing physicians, one of whom represents a medical school faculty and one of whom has the experience of treating Lyme disease, appointed by the Director of Public Health:

Τ	(3) one advanced practice registered nurse selected
2	from the recommendations of professional nursing
3	associations, appointed by the Director of Public Health;
4	(4) one local public health administrator, appointed
5	by the Director of Public Health;
6	(5) 2 veterinarians, one of whom must be a practicing
7	Doctor of Veterinary Medicine one veterinarian, appointed
8	by the Director of Public Health;
9	(6) 4 members of the public interested in Lyme
10	disease, appointed by the Director of Public Health; and
11	(7) <u>one medical entomologist.</u> 2 members appointed by
12	the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
13	(8) 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader of the
14	House of Representatives;
15	(9) 2 members appointed by the President of the
16	Senate; and
17	(10) 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader of the
18	Senate.
19	(c) The terms of the members of the Task Force shall be 3
20	years. Members may continue to serve after the expiration of a
21	term until a new member is appointed. Each member appointed to
22	fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term
23	for which his predecessor was appointed shall be appointed for
24	the remainder of such term. The council shall meet as
25	frequently as the chairman deems necessary, but not less than
26	$\underline{4}$ $\underline{2}$ times each year. Members shall receive no compensation for

- 1 their services.
- 2 (d) The Lyme Disease Task Force has the following duties 3 and responsibilities:
 - (1) monitoring the implementation of this Act and providing feedback and input for necessary additions or modifications;
 - (2) reviewing relevant literature and guidelines that define accurate diagnosis of Lyme disease with the purpose of creating cohesive and consistent guidelines for the determination of Lyme diagnosis across all counties in Illinois and with the intent of providing accurate and relevant numbers to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;
 - (3) providing recommendations on professional continuing educational materials and opportunities that specifically focus on Lyme disease prevention, protection, and treatment; and
 - (4) assisting the Department in establishing policies, procedures, techniques, and criteria for the collection, maintenance, exchange, and sharing of medical information on Lyme disease, and identifying persons or entities with Lyme disease expertise to collaborate with Department in Lyme disease diagnosis, prevention, and treatment.
